#### AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), entitled 1 "An act providing for the payment of death benefits to the 2 surviving spouse or children or parents of firefighters, 3 ambulance service or rescue squad members, law enforcement 4 officers or National Guard members who die as a result of the 5 performance of their duties," further providing for title of 6 act; and adding provisions relating to district attorneys and 7 public defenders. 8

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. The title of the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424,

12 No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement

13 Personnel Death Benefits Act, is amended to read:

3 Section 2. Section 1(a), (a.1) and (d) of the act are 4 amended and the section is amended by adding subsections to 5 read:

6 Section 1. (a) In the event a law enforcement officer, 7 district attorney, public defender, ambulance service or rescue squad member, firefighter, certified hazardous material response 8 team member, member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol or 9 10 National Guard member dies as a result of the performance of his duties, an application, including a certification of death, 11 shall be made to the department within three years of the date 12 of such death by any of the following: 13

14 (1) A political subdivision.

15 (2) A Commonwealth agency.

16 (3) In the case of National Guard members, the Adjutant 17 General.

18 (4) In the case of a member of a Commonwealth law19 enforcement agency, the agency head.

20 (5) In the case of a campus police officer, the university 21 or college president.

(6) Any survivor eligible for payment of benefits under this
act or individual authorized to act on the survivor's behalf.
(7) In the case of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol, the
State Commander.

(a.1) A firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad
member, law enforcement officer, <u>district attorney</u>, <u>public</u>
<u>defender</u>, certified hazardous material response team member,
member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol or National Guard
member who suffers a fatal heart attack or stroke while on duty

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or not later than 24 hours after participating in a physical
 training exercise or responding to an emergency is presumed to
 have died as a result of the performance of his duties for
 purposes of this act.

6 (d) Upon receipt of such certification, the Commonwealth 7 shall, from moneys payable out of the General Fund, pay to the 8 surviving spouse or, if there is no surviving spouse, to the 9 minor children of the paid firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member [or], law enforcement officer, district 10 attorney or public defender who died as a result of the 11 performance of his duty the sum of \$100,000, adjusted in 12 13 accordance with subsection (f) of this section and an amount 14 equal to the monthly salary, adjusted in accordance with 15 subsection (f) of this section, of the deceased paid 16 firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member [or]\_ law enforcement officer, district attorney or public defender, less 17 18 any workers' compensation or pension or retirement benefits paid 19 to such survivors, and shall continue such monthly payments 20 until there is no eligible beneficiary to receive them. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "eligible beneficiary" 21 means the surviving spouse or the child or children under the 22 23 age of eighteen years or, if attending college, under the age of 24 twenty-three years, of the firefighter, ambulance service or 25 rescue squad member [or] \_ law enforcement officer, district\_ attorney or public defender who died as a result of the 26 performance of his duty. When no spouse or minor children 27 28 survive, a single sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with 29 subsection (f) of this section, shall be paid to the parent or parents of such firefighter, ambulance service member, rescue 30

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1 squad member [or], law enforcement officer, district attorney or 2 public defender.

(h) A district attorney shall be deemed to be acting in the
performance of his duties for the purposes of this act when
acting in accordance with Article XIV of the act of August 9,
1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code.
(i) A public defender shall be deemed to be acting in the

9 performance of his duties for the purposes of this act when 10 acting in accordance with the act of December 2, 1968 (P.L.1144,

11 No.358), known as the Public Defender Act.

Section 3. Sections 2 and 2.1 of the act are amended to read:

14 Section 2. The following words and phrases when used in this 15 act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless 16 the context clearly indicates otherwise:

17 "Certified hazardous material response team member" means a 18 person who is part of a group of individuals who are certified 19 and organized by a Commonwealth agency, a local agency or a 20 regional hazardous material organization for the primary purpose of providing emergency response services which is dispatched by 21 a public safety answering point to mitigate actual or potential 22 23 immediate threats to public health and the environment in 24 response to the release or threat of a release of a hazardous 25 material, which is certified, trained and equipped in accordance 26 with the act of December 7, 1990 (P.L.639, No.165), known as the Hazardous Material Emergency Planning and Response Act. 27 28 Hazardous material response team members who are dispatched by a 29 public safety answering point may also be certified to perform 30 stabilization actions needed to remove threats to public health

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and the environment from hazardous material releases. A member 1 2 of a for-profit hazardous material response team that was not 3 dispatched by a public safety answering point, is acting as an agent on behalf of the spiller or responsible party or is 4 5 responsible for post-emergency or nonemergency response 6 hazardous materials/hazardous waste clean-up activities is not 7 eligible for compensation that is provided for under this act. "Department" means the Department of General Services of the 8 9 Commonwealth.

### 10 <u>"District attorney" means an elected or appointed district</u> 11 attorney or an assistant district attorney.

12 "Firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or law enforcement officer" means a firefighter; a member of a 13 14 volunteer fire company; a member of an ambulance service or 15 rescue squad; a peace officer as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 501 16 (relating to definitions); a public servant concerned in 17 official detention as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5121 (relating to 18 escape); an officer or employee of a State correctional 19 institution; guards or employees of county jails and prisons; or 20 any other law enforcement officer employed by the Commonwealth or a political subdivision. 21

## 22 "Public defender" means a public defender or an assistant 23 public defender.

Public safety answering point" means the Pennsylvania
Emergency Management Agency-approved first point at which calls
for emergency assistance from individuals are answered, operated
24 hours a day.

28 Section 2.1. This act shall be broadly construed to grant 29 benefits to firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad 30 members, law enforcement officers, district attorneys, public

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- 1 <u>defenders</u> or National Guard personnel for deaths related to the
- 2 performance of their duties.
- 3 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
