AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in open meetings, further providing
- for definitions, for minutes of meetings, public records and
- 4 recording of meetings, for public notice, for public
- 5 participation and for use of equipment during meetings.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The definition of "public notice" in section 703
- 9 of Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended
- 10 and the section is amended by adding definitions to read:
- 11 § 703. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 * * *
- 16 "Authorized telecommunications device." A device which
- 17 permits, at a minimum, audio communication between individuals.
- 18 "Broadcast." The transmission of a meeting via radio,
- 19 television, telecommunications, Internet website or any other

- 1 <u>electronic means</u>, which is intended to be received by or
- 2 available to the public. The term shall not include the
- 3 <u>recording of a meeting.</u>
- 4 * * *
- 5 <u>"EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES." EMERGENCY OR EXTRAORDINARY</u>

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- 6 <u>SITUATIONS OR CONDITIONS RESULTING IN A BOARD OR COUNCIL OF A</u>
- 7 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR OF AN AUTHORITY CREATED BY A POLITICAL
- 8 <u>SUBDIVISION BEING UNABLE TO PROVIDE FOR A PUBLIC MEETING IN A</u>
- 9 PHYSICAL LOCATION DUE TO FACTORS BEYOND THE BOARD'S, COUNCIL'S
- 10 OR AUTHORITY'S CONTROL PRESENTING A SUBSTANTIAL DANGER TO THE
- 11 HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE OF MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC OR MEMBERS OF
- 12 THE BOARD, COUNCIL OR AUTHORITY. THE TERM INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT
- 13 <u>LIMITED TO, A DISASTER AND DISASTER EMERGENCY AS DEFINED IN 35</u>
- 14 PA.C.S. § 7102 (RELATING TO DEFINITIONS).

- 16 "Public notice."
- 17 (1) For a meeting:
- Publication of notice of the place, date and 18 19 time of a meeting in a newspaper of general circulation, 20 as defined by 45 Pa.C.S. § 101 (relating to definitions), 21 which is published and circulated in the political 22 subdivision where the meeting will be held, or in a 23 newspaper of general circulation which has a bona fide 24 paid circulation in the political subdivision equal to or 25 greater than any newspaper published in the political 26 subdivision.
 - (ii) Posting a notice of the place, date [and],
 time, method of broadcast and acceptance of remote public
 comment, if applicable, of a meeting prominently at the
 principal office of the agency holding the meeting or at

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- 1 the public building in which the meeting is to be held.
- 2 (iii) Giving notice to parties under section 709(c)
- 3 (relating to public notice).
- 4 (2) For a recessed or reconvened meeting:
- 5 (i) Posting a notice of the place, date [and], time,
- 6 <u>method of broadcast and acceptance of remote public</u>
- 7 <u>comment, if applicable,</u> of the meeting prominently at the
- 8 principal office of the agency holding the meeting or at
- 9 the public building in which the meeting is to be held.
- 10 (ii) Giving notice to parties under section 709(c).
- 11 * * *
- 12 Section 2. Section 706 of Title 65 is amended by adding a
- 13 paragraph to read:
- 14 § 706. Minutes of meetings, public records and recording of
- meetings.
- Written minutes shall be kept of all open meetings of
- 17 agencies. The minutes shall include:

- 19 (5) A statement disclosing the availability of a
- 20 broadcast of a meeting and the acceptance of remote public
- 21 <u>comment, if applicable. If a recording of the meeting is</u>
- 22 <u>available on an Internet website, the statement shall include</u>
- 23 the web address or uniform resource locator to the recording
- of the meeting at the time when the minutes of the meeting
- are approved.

- 30 (c.1) Notification of agency business to be considered. --

1 (1) In addition to any public notice required under this

5 <u>(iv) If the agency broadcasts the meeting, the</u>

6 <u>agenda shall include information on the method of</u>

7 <u>broadcast.</u>

- 8 <u>(v) If the agency adopts rules for remote public</u>
- 9 <u>comment under section 711(d) (relating to use of</u>
- 10 equipment during meetings), the agenda shall include
- information on where the rules for remote public comment
- 12 <u>can be accessed.</u>

- Section 4. Sections 710.1 and 711 of Title 65 are amended by
- 15 adding subsections to read:
- 16 § 710.1. Public participation.
- 17 * * *
- 18 (e) Remote public comment.--If a board or council of a
- 19 political subdivision or of an authority created by a political
- 20 <u>subdivision adopts rules for remote public comment under section</u>
- 21 711(d) (relating to use of equipment during meetings), in the
- 22 event that remote public comment cannot be received by the
- 23 manner advertised or by a contingency plan under section 711(d)
- 24 (2) due to an Internet service outage or other technological
- 25 failure of the board or council of a political subdivision or of
- 26 the authority created by a political subdivision, official
- 27 action of a matter shall be postponed until the next advertised
- 28 meeting.
- 29 § 711. Use of equipment during meetings.

(c) Local broadcast rules. --

(1) A board or council of a political subdivision or of an authority created by a political subdivision may adopt rules governing the broadcast of a meeting.

- (2) Except as provided under paragraph (3), a board or council of a political subdivision or of an authority created by a political subdivision broadcasting a meeting using an Internet website, mobile application or social media platform shall broadcast the entire meeting except for an executive session.
- or council of a political subdivision or of an authority created by a political subdivision may not be muted or edited unless it is essential to exclude speech at the meeting that is not protected by the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States or the speech may expose the board or council to legal liability if the speech is not excluded.

 Speech excluded under this paragraph shall be explained in the minutes of the meeting. If a recording or broadcast of a meeting is edited, the board or council shall retain an archived copy of the unedited recording or broadcast for no less than one year following the date of the meeting.

 (d) Remote public comment.—
- 24 (1) The board or council of a political subdivision or
 25 of an authority created by a political subdivision may adopt
 26 rules permitting the acceptance of remote public comment by
 27 the use of an authorized telecommunications device. Nothing
 28 in this paragraph shall be construed to authorize the board
 29 or council holding a meeting at a physical location to
 20 exclude public participation under section 710.1 at the

2	(2) A rule under this subsection may include:
3	(i) A requirement that an individual seeking to
4	offer public comment must demonstrate that the individual
5	is entitled to offer public comment under section
6	710.1(a).
7	(ii) A process to allow an individual seeking to be
8	recognized for remote public comment to be placed on a
9	<u>list or in a virtual queue.</u>
10	(iii) A contingency plan to allow remote public
11	comment to be received during a meeting by telephone
12	audible throughout the meeting location by amplification
13	<pre>only if:</pre>
14	(A) the advertised authorized telecommunications
15	device is unable to be utilized by the political
16	subdivision or authority during the meeting because
17	of an Internet service outage or other technological
18	failure impacting the device's operation at the
19	meeting location; and
20	(B) a notice placed on the posted meeting agenda
21	provides contact information for the telephone.
22	(3) A board or council of a political subdivision or of
23	an authority created by a political subdivision that adopts
24	local broadcast rules under subsection (c) may not mandate
25	the exclusive use of remote comment, unless the meeting is
26	held due to EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES OR DURING a declaration of <
27	disaster emergency under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
28	general authority of Governor) or 7501(b) (relating to
29	general authority of political subdivisions).
30	(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to

- 1 <u>authorize the acceptance of written comments through a social</u>
- 2 <u>media platform, email or web platform as a substitute for</u>
- 3 public comment under section 710.1.
- 4 (5) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
- 5 require a board or council of a political subdivision or of
- an authority created by a political subdivision to accept
- 7 remote public comment as part of the local broadcast rules
- 8 <u>under subsection (c).</u>
- 9 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
