AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," providing for State-related 5 university performance-based funding incentive. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XX-L 13 STATE-RELATED UNIVERSITY 14 PERFORMANCE-BASED FUNDING INCENTIVE 15 Section 2001-L. Scope of article. 16 This article relates to the State-related University 17 Performance-Based Incentive awarded to State-related 18 universities. Section 2002-L. Definitions. 19 20 The following words and phrases when used in this article

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 3 "Advisory council." The Performance-based Funding Advisory
- 4 <u>Council established under section 2003-L.</u>
- 5 <u>"Base State funding." The amount of funding appropriated to</u>
- 6 <u>each State-related university during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.</u>
- 7 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 8 Commonwealth.
- 9 "Institutional investment." A reallocated percentage, no
- 10 less than 3% nor more than 10%, of the aggregate base State
- 11 funding to the State-related universities as determined by the
- 12 <u>advisory council.</u>
- 13 "Net tuition." The amount a student pays for tuition after
- 14 <u>financial aid as published tuition less all grant aid, including</u>
- 15 Federal, State, local and institutional grants, and tax
- 16 benefits.
- 17 "Performance-based funding incentive." Consists of the
- 18 <u>following:</u>
- 19 (1) Institutional investment.
- 20 (2) New State funding, exceeding the base State funding,
- 21 appropriated by the General Assembly for this purpose.
- 22 "State-related university." The Pennsylvania State
- 23 University, including the Pennsylvania College of Technology,
- 24 the University of Pittsburgh and Temple University and
- 25 <u>associated branch campuses.</u>
- 26 "State wage interchange system." A system developed by the
- 27 <u>United States Department of Labor and United States Department</u>
- 28 of Education to facilitate the interstate exchange of wage data
- 29 <u>between participating state agencies in order to satisfy</u>
- 30 performance reporting requirements under the Workforce

- 1 Innovation and Opportunities Act (Public Law 113-128, 128 Stat.
- 2 1425).
- 3 Section 2003-L. Performance-based Funding Advisory Council.
- 4 (a) Establishment. -- The Performance-based Funding Advisory
- 5 Council is established within the department for the purpose of
- 6 allocating State funding to State-related universities based on
- 7 student outcomes.
- 8 (b) Membership. -- The advisory council shall consist of the
- 9 following members:
- 10 (1) The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth or a
- 11 <u>designee</u>.
- 12 (2) The Deputy Secretary of Postsecondary and Higher
- 13 <u>Education or a designee.</u>
- 14 (3) Two individuals appointed by the President pro
- 15 <u>tempore of the Senate.</u>
- 16 (4) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
- 17 the Senate.
- 18 (5) Two individuals appointed by the Speaker of the
- 19 House of Representatives.
- 20 (6) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
- 21 the House of Representatives.
- 22 (7) Two current Pennsylvania residents with recognized
- 23 subject matter expertise in higher education funding, who
- 24 must be appointed by the Governor.
- 25 (c) Chairperson. -- The chairperson and vice chairperson of
- 26 the advisory council shall be selected by the members of the
- 27 <u>advisory council.</u>
- 28 (d) Term. -- Members of the advisory council appointed
- 29 pursuant to this section shall serve terms as follows:
- 30 (1) A member appointed under subsection (b) (3), (4), (5)

- or (6) shall serve a three-year term.
- 2 (2) A member appointed under subsection (b) (7) shall
- 3 serve a four-year term.
- 4 (3) After the expiration of each initial term:
- 5 (i) A member appointed under subsection (b) (3), (4),
- 6 (5) or (6) shall be appointed for a term of four years.
- 7 <u>(ii) A member appointed under subsection (b) (7)</u>
- 8 <u>shall be appointed for a term of five years.</u>
- 9 (e) Quorum. -- A majority of the members of the advisory
- 10 council shall constitute a quorum, and a quorum shall be
- 11 <u>required for all actions.</u>
- 12 (f) Vacancies. -- A vacancy occurring on the advisory council
- 13 by resignation, removal, death or other reason shall be filled
- 14 within 30 business days of the vacancy in the manner in which
- 15 that position was originally filled. An individual appointed to
- 16 fill a vacancy shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the
- 17 member who created the vacancy.
- 18 (q) Reimbursement of expenses. -- The members of the advisory
- 19 council may not receive compensation for their services but
- 20 shall be reimbursed by the department for all necessary travel
- 21 and other reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the
- 22 performance of their duties.
- 23 (h) Administrative support.--The department shall provide
- 24 administrative support, data, research, meeting space and other
- 25 <u>assistance or information required by the advisory council to</u>
- 26 carry out its duties under this article.
- 27 (i) Actions. -- A vote of the majority of the members of the
- 28 advisory council shall be sufficient for all actions taken by
- 29 the advisory council.
- 30 <u>(j) Meetings.--</u>

- 1 (1) The advisory council shall meet no less than four
- 2 <u>times a year at the call of the chair.</u>
- 3 (2) The advisory council shall hold its first meeting no
- 4 <u>later than 90 business days after the effective date of this</u>
- 5 section.
- 6 (3) All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with
- 7 the requirements of 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open
- 8 <u>meetings</u>).
- 9 Section 2004-L. Duties of the advisory council.
- 10 The advisory council shall:
- 11 (1) Adopt guidelines to administer the program.
- 12 (2) Adopt performance-based metrics and minimum
- 13 <u>benchmarks pursuant to section 2006-L to evaluate each State-</u>
- 14 <u>related university's performance for eligibility to receive</u>
- performance-based funding from the Commonwealth.
- 16 <u>(3) Monitor State-related universities with performance</u>
- improvement plans.
- 18 (4) Consult with the department and other Commonwealth
- 19 <u>agencies and utilize experts to assist in carrying out the</u>
- 20 <u>duties of this article.</u>
- 21 (5) Hold hearings and receive input from interested
- 22 parties, including State-related universities, parents and
- 23 students.
- 24 Section 2005-L. State-related university performance-based
- funding incentive.
- 26 Beginning with the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the department
- 27 shall award a performance-based funding incentive, using
- 28 performance-based metrics adopted by the advisory council under
- 29 <u>section 2006-L, to a State-related university.</u>
- 30 Section 2006-L. Performance-based metrics.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- The advisory council shall adopt the
- 2 following performance-based metrics to evaluate a State-related
- 3 university's performance for eligibility to receive performance-
- 4 <u>based funding from the Commonwealth:</u>
- 5 <u>(1) The four-year graduation rate for first-time-in-</u>
- 6 <u>college students.</u>
- 7 (2) The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled
- 8 who received a Pell Grant during the previous school year.
- 9 (3) The six-year graduation rate for students who are
- 10 awarded a Pell Grant in their first year.
- 11 (4) The four-year graduation rate for baccalaureate
- 12 <u>students.</u>
- 13 <u>(5) Student retention rates.</u>
- 14 (6) Bachelor's degree production per 100 full-time
- 15 enrolled students.
- 16 (7) Net tuition and fees per 120 credit hours.
- 17 (8) Postgraduation employment rates and salaries,
- including wage thresholds that reflect the added value of a
- 19 <u>baccalaureate degree. The department shall provide wage data</u>
- from the State wage interchange system to the advisory
- 21 council.
- 22 (9) The number of students enrolled and the number of
- 23 degrees attained in the following fields:
- (i) Agriculture.
- 25 <u>(ii) Science.</u>
- 26 (iii) Technology.
- 27 <u>(iv) Engineering.</u>
- 28 (v) Mathematics.
- 29 <u>(10) The number of high school students who are dual</u>
- 30 enrolled, and the number of credits earned.

- 1 (11) The percentage of credits articulated.
- 2 (12) Other metrics provided by each State-related
- 3 <u>university.</u>
- 4 (b) Benchmarks to be adopted. -- The advisory council shall
- 5 <u>adopt benchmarks to evaluate a State-related university's</u>
- 6 <u>achievement of institutional excellence or need for improvement</u>
- 7 and minimum requirements for eligibility to receive a
- 8 <u>performance-based funding incentive.</u>
- 9 (c) Periodic review. -- The advisory council shall review, and
- 10 revise if necessary, the performance-based funding metrics and
- 11 benchmarks at least every five years. Within 60 days of the
- 12 <u>completion of the review, the advisory council shall issue a</u>
- 13 report to the Governor, the department and the General Assembly,
- 14 post the report on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 15 website and transmit notice of the updates to the Legislative
- 16 Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 17 (d) Adjustment prohibited. -- After they are published in the
- 18 Pennsylvania Bulletin, metrics and benchmarks may not be
- 19 adjusted for the next fiscal year.
- 20 Section 2007-L. Allocation of funding.
- 21 (a) General rule.--Beginning with the 2023-2024 fiscal year,
- 22 the amount of funds available for allocation to the State-
- 23 <u>related universities based on the performance-based funding</u>
- 24 provisions of this article shall consist of the State's
- 25 investment in performance funding plus institutional
- 26 <u>investments</u>, represented by money to be redistributed from the
- 27 <u>base State funding.</u>
- 28 (b) Minimum eligibility thresholds and benchmarks.--
- 29 <u>(1) The advisory council shall establish minimum</u>
- 30 performance funding eligibility thresholds or benchmarks for

- 1 <u>the State's investment and the institutional investments.</u>
- 2 (2) A State-related university that meets the minimum
- 3 institutional threshold, but fails to meet the minimum State
- 4 <u>investment eligibility threshold, shall have its</u>
- 5 <u>institutional investment restored but is ineligible for a</u>
- 6 share of the State's investment in performance funding.
- 7 (3) The institutional investment shall be restored for
- 8 <u>all State-related universities eligible for the State's</u>
- 9 <u>investment under the performance-based funding model.</u>
- 10 (c) Determination of share. -- A State-related university's
- 11 share of the performance funding shall be calculated based on
- 12 the university's relative performance on the established metrics
- 13 <u>in conjunction with the institutional size and scope.</u>
- 14 (d) Annual distribution. -- The department shall annually
- 15 <u>distribute performance-based funding</u>, as provided in this
- 16 article, to each of the approved State-related universities.
- 17 (e) Report.--By December 31 of each year money is
- 18 appropriated for a performance-based funding incentive, the
- 19 advisory council shall submit a report containing the rankings
- 20 and award distributions to the Governor, the department and the
- 21 General Assembly. A copy of the report shall be posted on the
- 22 department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 23 Section 2008-L. Improvement plans.
- 24 (a) Withholding of institutional investment. -- The department
- 25 shall withhold a portion of a State-related university's
- 26 institutional investment withheld if the university fails to
- 27 meet the minimum institutional investment performance funding
- 28 <u>eligibility threshold or benchmark. The State-related university</u>
- 29 shall submit an improvement plan to the advisory council that
- 30 specifies the activities and strategies for improving the

- 1 <u>university's performance.</u>
- 2 (b) Review of improvement plan. -- The advisory council shall
- 3 review the improvement plan and, if the plan is approved,
- 4 monitor the university's progress in implementing the activities
- 5 and strategies specified in the improvement plan.
- 6 (c) Monitoring reports. -- The State-related university shall
- 7 <u>submit monitoring reports to the advisory board by December 31</u>
- 8 and May 31 of each year in which an improvement plan is in
- 9 place. The ability of the university to submit an improvement
- 10 plan to the advisory board is limited to one fiscal year.
- 11 (d) Period of withheld institutional investment. --
- 12 (1) The department shall withhold disbursement of the
- institutional investment until the monitoring report is
- 14 <u>approved by the advisory council.</u>
- 15 (2) A State-related university determined by the
- 16 <u>advisory council to be making satisfactory progress on</u>
- implementing the improvement plan shall receive no more than
- 18 one-half of the withheld institutional investment in January
- 19 <u>and the balance of the withheld institutional investment in</u>
- 20 June.
- 21 (3) A State-related university that fails to make
- 22 satisfactory progress may not have the university's full
- 23 <u>institutional investment restored. Institutional investment</u>
- funds that are not restored shall be redistributed in
- 25 accordance with the advisory council's performance-based
- 26 metrics.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
