## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 18 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in Office of State Inspector General, further 21 22 providing for powers, purpose and duties and for criminal 23 charges.

- 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 25 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Sections 503-A(c) and 506-A of the act of April
- 27 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of

- 6 (12.1) Within 30 days of the effective date of this

- 9 <u>illicit payment and identity theft associated with the</u>
- 10 <u>unemployment compensation program established under the act</u>
- of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1),
- 12 known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, including
- 13 <u>supplemental or extended unemployment compensation benefits</u>
- 14 programs administered by the Department of Labor and Industry
- 15 <u>under section 608 of the Unemployment Compensation Law. This</u>
- paragraph shall expire December 31, 2026.

- 18 Section 506-A. Criminal charges.
- 19 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State
- 20 Inspector General shall have the power to investigate and may
- 21 file criminal charges for a violation of any of the following:
