- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 12 "Active first responder." A member of a first response
- 13 <u>organization</u>.
- 14 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 15 Agency.
- 16 "Approved institution of higher learning." A degree-granting
- 17 or certificate-granting educational institution, including a
- 18 vocational school, that:
- 19 (1) offers a postsecondary program of education;
- 20 (2) is located in this Commonwealth; and
- 21 (3) is approved by the agency.
- 22 <u>"Approved program of education." A curriculum or course of</u>
- 23 study pursued at an approved institution of higher learning as
- 24 determined by the agency.
- 25 "Emergency medical services agency." As defined in section
- 26 8103 (relating to definitions).
- 27 <u>"Executive officer." The chief or president of the first</u>
- 28 response organization that a qualified applicant serves.
- 29 <u>"First response organization." Any of the following:</u>
- 30 (1) An emergency medical services agency.

- 1 (2) A volunteer fire company.
- 2 (3) A volunteer rescue company.
- 3 "Program." The First Responder Loan Forgiveness Program
- 4 <u>established in section 79A42 (relating to First Responder Loan</u>
- 5 <u>Forgiveness Program</u>).
- 6 "Qualified applicant." An active first responder who
- 7 <u>qualifies for loan forgiveness under section 79A43 (relating to</u>
- 8 award of loan forgiveness).
- 9 <u>"Volunteer fire company." As defined in section 7802</u>
- 10 (relating to definitions).
- "Volunteer rescue company." As defined in section 7802.
- 12 § 79A42. First Responder Loan Forgiveness Program.
- 13 <u>(a) Program established.--The First Responder Loan</u>
- 14 Forgiveness Program is established. The program shall provide
- 15 loan forgiveness awards to qualified applicants in accordance
- 16 with this subchapter. The agency shall administer the program
- 17 for active first responders on a Statewide basis.
- 18 (b) Applicants. -- An active first responder must meet the
- 19 following criteria to apply for loan forgiveness under this
- 20 subchapter:
- 21 (1) Is a resident of this Commonwealth.
- 22 (2) Has been an active first responder, as certified in
- 23 <u>accordance with section 79A47 (relating to certification), in</u>
- this Commonwealth for at least the 12 months immediately
- 25 <u>preceding the application.</u>
- 26 (3) Enrolled as a student in an approved program of
- 27 <u>education and completed a postsecondary degree or</u>
- 28 certification program after the effective date of this
- 29 <u>section</u>.
- 30 (4) Provides the agency with a sworn or official

- 1 statement by the executive officer attesting that the
- 2 applicant is a member in good standing of the first response
- 3 <u>organization.</u>
- 4 § 79A43. Award of loan forgiveness.
- 5 The agency may provide loan forgiveness for an active first
- 6 responder who, in the first year as an active first responder
- 7 <u>following agency approval of the application made in accordance</u>
- 8 with section 79A42 (relating to First Responder Loan Forgiveness
- 9 Program) and, in each subsequent year, meets all of the
- 10 <u>following criteria:</u>
- 11 (1) Is a recipient of a federally insured student loan.
- 12 (2) Executes a sworn affidavit, under penalty of
- 13 perjury, that the individual does not have a delinquent
- 14 <u>payment owing to any Commonwealth agency.</u>
- 15 § 79A44. Amount of awards.
- 16 (a) Loan forgiveness. -- Federally insured student loans for
- 17 an approved program of education provided to a qualified
- 18 applicant may be forgiven by the agency as follows:
- 19 <u>(1) The agency may forgive a qualified applicant's</u>
- original qualifying loans in an amount up to \$16,000.
- 21 (2) The total amount of the award shall not exceed \$135
- 22 per credit hour earned in the approved program of education.
- 23 (3) Payment of the award shall be made in accordance
- with the procedures established by the agency.
- 25 <u>(4) A qualified applicant may receive loan forgiveness</u>
- 26 awards as follows:
- (i) First year of active first responder status
- following qualified application in an amount up to
- 29 \$4,000, but not exceeding 25% of the original qualifying
- 30 loans.

- 1 (ii) Second year of active first responder status
- 2 <u>following qualified application in an amount up to</u>
- 3 \$4,000, but not exceeding 25% of the original qualifying
- 4 <u>loans.</u>
- 5 (iii) Third year of active first responder status
- following qualified application in an amount up to
- 7 \$8,000, but not exceeding 50% of the original qualifying
- 8 loans.
- 9 (b) Preference. -- The agency may give preference in approving
- 10 loan forgiveness awards under the program to renewal
- 11 <u>applications</u>.
- 12 <u>§ 79A45</u>. Funding.
- 13 The agency may approve loan forgiveness awards only to the
- 14 <u>extent that funds are appropriated by the General Assembly and</u>
- 15 are sufficient to cover administration of the program. In the
- 16 event that funding is insufficient to fully fund administration
- 17 and awards to all qualified applicants, the agency shall prorate
- 18 loan forgiveness awards.
- 19 § 79A46. Point system.
- 20 (a) General rule. -- A point system establishing the
- 21 requirements for annual certification of active first responders
- 22 shall be developed and implemented by the executive officer.
- 23 (b) Factors.--The point system shall be used to determine
- 24 whether to certify an individual as an active first responder
- 25 <u>and shall include the following factors:</u>
- 26 (1) The number of emergency calls to which the
- 27 individual responded.
- 28 (2) The individual's level of training and participation
- in formal training or drills.
- 30 (3) Time spent by the individual on administration and

- support activities, including maintenance of facilities and
- 2 <u>equipment.</u>
- 3 (4) Involvement by the individual in fundraising and
- 4 <u>other projects that directly benefit the organization's</u>
- 5 <u>financial viability, emergency response or operational</u>
- 6 readiness.
- 7 § 79A47. Certification.
- 8 (a) Application. -- An applicant for certification as an
- 9 <u>active first responder must submit a signed application to the</u>
- 10 executive officer.
- 11 (b) Local sign-off.--The executive officer and another
- 12 officer of the first response organization shall:
- 13 (1) Sign the application attesting to the individual's
- 14 <u>status as an active first responder.</u>
- 15 (2) Forward the application to the agency for final
- 16 <u>review and processing.</u>
- 17 § 79A48. Regulations.
- 18 The agency shall promulgate regulations and establish rules
- 19 or adopt guidelines, including forms, necessary to administer
- 20 this subchapter.
- 21 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or
- 22 immediately, whichever is later.
