A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress of the United States and the United States
- Environmental Protection Agency to take action and end
- regulations relating to vehicle emissions testing.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States enacted the Clean
- 5 Air Act in 1970, which authorized the United States
- 6 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to establish the National
- 7 Ambient Air Quality Standards to protect public health and
- 8 welfare and to regulate emissions of hazardous air pollutants;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, Federal and state regulations have been promulgated
- 11 under the Clean Air Act to limit emissions and regulate air
- 12 pollution; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The EPA works with its Federal, state and tribal
- 14 regulatory partners through a comprehensive clean air compliance
- 15 monitoring program to ensure that regulated communities obey
- 16 environmental laws and regulations through inspections and tools
- 17 to help meet environmental regulatory requirements; and
- 18 WHEREAS, In October 1995, the Commonwealth announced

- 1 Pennsylvania's decentralized Vehicle Emissions Inspection and
- 2 Maintenance Program that was designed to meet this
- 3 Commonwealth's regional clean air goals; and
- 4 WHEREAS, By June 2004, 25 counties implemented a vehicle
- 5 emission testing program, bringing this Commonwealth into
- 6 compliance with the Clean Air Act; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Electric vehicles and diesel-powered vehicles are
- 8 federally exempt from the Vehicle Emissions Inspection and
- 9 Maintenance Program; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Vehicle emissions tests are no longer effective at
- 11 reducing air pollution due to new, fuel-efficient vehicles and a
- 12 heightened focus and promised manufacturing support on fuel-
- 13 efficient vehicles; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United
- 16 States and the United States Environmental Protection Agency to
- 17 take action and end regulations relating to vehicle emissions
- 18 testing; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Governor to petition the
- 21 Congress of the United States, the United States Department of
- 22 Transportation and the United States Environmental Protection
- 23 Agency to consider legislation or regulations that would reform,
- 24 or end, emissions testing and eliminate unnecessary barriers
- 25 that are being inflicted upon residents of this Commonwealth;
- 26 and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 28 the President of the United States, the Vice President of the
- 29 United States, the United States Secretary of Energy, the
- 30 presiding officers of Congress, the chair and ranking member of

- 1 the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation,
- 2 the chair and ranking member of the Senate Committee on
- 3 Environment and Public Works, the chair and ranking member of
- 4 the House Committee on Energy and Commerce, the chair and
- 5 ranking member of the House Committee on Transportation and
- 6 Infrastructure, each member of Congress from Pennsylvania and
- 7 the Governor.
