AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing 2 for speed timing devices. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 3368(c), (d), (e) and (f)(2) of Title 756 7 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section is amended by adding subsections to read: 8 9 § 3368. Speed timing devices. * * * 10 (c) Mechanical, electrical and electronic devices 11 authorized. --12
- 13 Except as otherwise provided in this section, the 14 rate of speed of any vehicle may be timed on any highway by a 15 police officer using a mechanical or electrical speed timing 16 device.
- [Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (3), 17 (2) electronic devices such as radio-microwave devices, commonly 18

- referred to as electronic speed meters or radar, may be used
 only as part of an automated speed enforcement system or by
 members of the Pennsylvania State Police.] Electronic devices
 such as radio-microwave devices, commonly referred to as
 electronic speed meters or radar, may be used only as part of
 an automated speed enforcement system or by any police
- 7 officer.

- (3) Electronic devices which calculate speed by measuring elapsed time between measured road surface points by using two sensors and devices which measure and calculate the average speed of a vehicle between any two points may be used by any police officer.
- [No person may be convicted upon evidence obtained 13 14 through the use of devices authorized by paragraphs (2) and 15 (3) unless the speed recorded is six or more miles per hour 16 in excess of the legal speed limit. Furthermore, no person 17 may be convicted upon evidence obtained through the use of 18 devices authorized by paragraph (3) in an area where the 19 legal speed limit is less than 55 miles per hour if the speed 20 recorded is less than ten miles per hour in excess of the 21 legal speed limit. This paragraph shall not apply to evidence 22 obtained through the use of devices authorized by paragraph (2) or (3) within a school zone or an active work zone.] \underline{A} 23 24 person may not be convicted upon evidence obtained through 25 the use of devices authorized by paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and 26 (5) unless the speed recorded is more than 10 miles per hour 27 in excess of the legal speed limit on a highway or six or 28 more miles per hour in excess of the legal speed limit on an 29 interstate highway or freeway with a posted speed limit of 70 30 miles per hour. This paragraph shall not apply to evidence

3	zone.
4	(5) Light detection and ranging devices, commonly
5	referred to as LIDAR, may be used only as part of an
6	automated speed enforcement system or by [members of the
7	Pennsylvania State Police] any police officer.
8	(6) Except for a member of the Pennsylvania State
9	Police, prior to use of an electronic speed meter, radar or
10	light detection and ranging devices:
11	(i) a police officer must complete a training course
12	approved by the Pennsylvania State Police and the
13	Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training
14	Commission; and
15	(ii) in accordance with department regulations,
16	official traffic-control devices, including advanced
17	warning signs indicating the use of electronic speed
18	meters, radar or light detection and ranging devices,
19	must be erected within 500 feet of the border of the
20	political subdivision on the main arteries entering the
21	political subdivision.
22	(7) A police officer of the Delaware River Port
23	Authority or the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission
24	may, on a highway under the jurisdiction of the Delaware
25	River Port Authority or the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge
26	Commission, use an electronic speed meter, radar or a light
27	detection and ranging device upon completion of a training
28	course approved by the Pennsylvania State Police and the
29	Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission.
30	(d) Classification, approval and testing of mechanical,

- 1 electrical and electronic devices. -- The department may, by
- 2 regulation, classify specific devices as being mechanical,
- 3 electrical or electronic. All mechanical, electrical or
- 4 electronic devices shall be of a type approved by the
- 5 department, which shall appoint stations for calibrating and
- 6 testing the devices and may prescribe regulations as to the
- 7 manner in which calibrations and tests shall be made. The
- 8 certification and calibration of electronic devices under
- 9 subsection (c)(3) shall also include the certification and
- 10 calibration of all equipment, timing strips and other devices
- 11 which are actually used with the particular electronic device
- 12 being certified and calibrated. Electronic devices commonly
- 13 referred to as electronic speed meters or radar shall have been
- 14 tested for accuracy within a period of one year prior to the
- 15 alleged violation. Other devices shall have been tested for
- 16 accuracy within a period of 60 days prior to the alleged
- 17 violation. A certificate from the station showing that the
- 18 calibration and test were made within the required period and
- 19 that the device was accurate shall be competent and prima facie
- 20 evidence of those facts in every proceeding in which a violation
- 21 of this title is charged. A device under subsection (c) (6) must
- 22 be calibrated and tested every 365 days at a minimum before
- 23 being used.
- 24 (e) Distance requirements for use of mechanical, electrical
- 25 and electronic devices. -- Mechanical, electrical or electronic
- 26 devices or light detection and ranging devices may not be used
- 27 to time the rate of speed of vehicles within 500 feet after a
- 28 speed limit sign indicating a decrease of speed. This limitation
- 29 on the use of speed timing devices shall not apply to speed
- 30 limit signs indicating school zones, bridge and elevated

- 1 structure speed limits, hazardous grade speed limits and work
- 2 zone speed limits.
- 3 (f) LIDAR testing and calibration.--
- 4 * * *
- 5 (2) LIDAR speed measuring devices and LIDAR systems
- 6 shall be calibrated and tested every 365 days at a minimum
- 7 before being utilized by [the Pennsylvania State Police] <u>any</u>
- 8 <u>police officer</u> or as part of an automated speed enforcement
- 9 system.

- 11 (g) Local ordinance required to enforce. --
- 12 (1) Prior to the use of a device under subsection (c)
- 13 (6), the political subdivision or each political subdivision
- of a regional police department must adopt an ordinance
- 15 <u>authorizing the local or regional police department to employ</u>
- the device on highways within the boundaries of each
- 17 political subdivision.
- 18 (2) During the initial 90 days of speed enforcement by a
- 19 local or regional police department of a political
- 20 subdivision, an individual may only be sanctioned for
- violations with a written warning.
- 22 (3) A device under subsection (c) (6) may not be used to
- 23 <u>time the rate of speed of vehicles within 500 feet after a</u>
- speed limit sign indicating a decrease of speed. This
- 25 limitation on the use of a device shall not apply to a speed
- limit sign indicating a school zone, bridge and elevated
- 27 <u>structure speed limit, hazardous grade speed limit and work</u>
- 28 zone speed limit.
- 29 (h) Excess revenue.--
- 30 (1) The primary use of a device under this section shall

- 1 <u>be for traffic safety purposes.</u>
- 2 (2) If a political subdivision's share of revenue
- 3 generated from speed enforcement citations by a device under
- 4 this section exceeds 10% of the total political subdivision's
- 5 <u>budget</u>, the excess sum shall be remitted to the Department of
- 6 Revenue on a form and in a manner prescribed by the
- 7 Department of Revenue on or before the 60th day following the
- 8 <u>end of the political subdivision's fiscal year for deposit</u>
- 9 into the Highway Safety Cadet Training Restricted Receipts
- 10 Fund, which is established in the General Fund for the
- 11 purpose of recruiting, training or equipping Pennsylvania
- 12 State Police Cadets.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
