## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Establishing a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative 1 commission to recommend improvements for the recruitment and 2 retention of law enforcement officers, corrections officers 3 and prosecutors in this Commonwealth and develop and promote legislation in furtherance of its recommendations. 5 6 WHEREAS, For there to be law and order in this Commonwealth the Commonwealth must have properly staffed law enforcement personnel in all counties and departments, properly staffed county and State correctional institutions and properly staffed 10 district attorneys' offices with qualified and experienced 11 prosecutors; and 12 WHEREAS, Recruitment and retention challenges for all three 13 professions are at unprecedented levels, presenting more 14 challenges for these public servants to do their jobs 15 effectively; and 16 WHEREAS, Vacancies in these professions result in delays of 17 justice and fears of a decrease in public safety; and 18 WHEREAS, It is vital for vacancies in these professions to be 19 filled in a timely manner to ensure law and order; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The passage of Senate Resolution No. 6 in 2017
- 2 established a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative
- 3 commission to recommend improvements to the delivery of
- 4 emergency services in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, This commission provided legislative recommendations
- 6 that have been enacted by the General Assembly and therefore
- 7 have improved the delivery of emergency services in this
- 8 Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 10 General Assembly establish a special bipartisan, bicameral
- 11 legislative commission to recommend improvements for the
- 12 recruitment and retention of law enforcement officers,
- 13 corrections officers and prosecutors in this Commonwealth and
- 14 develop and promote legislation in furtherance of its
- 15 recommendations; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the commission consist of the following
- 17 members:
- 18 (1) Four Senators, two from the majority party and two
- 19 from the minority party, appointed by the President pro
- tempore of the Senate.
- 21 (2) Four Representatives, two from the majority party
- and two from the minority party, appointed by the Speaker of
- the House of Representatives.
- 24 (3) A designee of the County Commissioners Association
- of Pennsylvania.
- 26 (4) A designee of the Pennsylvania Municipal League.
- 27 (5) A designee of the Pennsylvania State Association of
- Boroughs.
- 29 (6) A designee of the Pennsylvania State Association of
- 30 Township Commissioners.

- 1 (7) A designee of the Pennsylvania State Association of
- 2 Township Supervisors.
- 3 (8) A designee of the Pennsylvania Councils of
- 4 Governments.
- 5 (9) The Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police or a
- 6 designee.
- 7 (10) A designee of the Municipal Police Officers'
- 8 Education and Training Commission.
- 9 (11) A designee of the Pennsylvania State Troopers
- 10 Association.
- 11 (12) A designee of the Pennsylvania Fraternal Order of
- 12 Police.
- 13 (13) A designee of the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police
- 14 Association.
- 15 (14) A designee of the Pennsylvania Sheriffs
- 16 Association.
- 17 (15) A designee of the Fraternal Order of Transit
- 18 Police.
- 19 (16) The Secretary of Corrections of this Commonwealth
- 20 or a designee.
- 21 (17) A designee of the Pennsylvania State Corrections
- 22 Officers Association.
- 23 (18) Two State corrections officers in this
- 24 Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President
- 25 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected
- 26 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 27 (19) Two county corrections officers in this
- Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President
- 29 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected
- 30 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- 1 (20) A designee of the Pennsylvania Bar Association.
- 2 (21) A designee of the Pennsylvania District Attorneys
- 3 Association.
- 4 (22) Six district attorneys in this Commonwealth who are
- 5 members of the Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association,
- 6 three of whom shall be selected by the President pro tempore
- 7 of the Senate and three of whom shall be selected by the
- 8 Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 9 and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the commission elect a chair from its
- 11 legislative membership; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the commission develop and recommend
- 13 legislation to improve recruitment and retention of law
- 14 enforcement officers, corrections officers and prosecutors; and
- 15 be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the commission hold hearings, take testimony
- 17 and make its investigations at such places as it deems necessary
- 18 in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 20 provide staff support and assist with the final report; and be
- 21 it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the commission make a final report of all
- 23 legislative recommendations by June 30, 2023, which shall be
- 24 submitted to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the
- 25 Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the members of the commission serve without
- 27 compensation but be reimbursed for all necessary and reasonable
- 28 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; and be it
- 29 further
- RESOLVED, That reasonable expenses incurred by the commission

- 1 be equally divided between the Senate and the House of
- 2 Representatives; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the approval of the President pro tempore of
- 4 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives be
- 5 required to preauthorize all proposed actions of the commission
- 6 which will entail the expenditure of State funds and approve all
- 7 expenditures, including expense reimbursement requests of
- 8 commission members, prior to payment.
