AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An
2 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and
3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and
4 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in
17 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and
18 brewed beverages, further providing for sales by liquor
19 licensees and restrictions.

20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
21 hereby enacts as follows:

22 Section 1. Section 406(f) (3) of the act of April 12, 1951
23 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, is amended to read:

24 Section 406. Sales by Liquor Licensees; Restrictions.--* * *

25 (f) The holder of a hotel or restaurant liquor license may

1 obtain an off-premises catering permit subject to section
2 493(33) to hold a catered function off the licensed premises and
3 on otherwise unlicensed premises where the licensee may sell
4 wine, liquor and malt or brewed beverages by the glass, open
5 bottle or other container, and in any mixture together with
6 food, for consumption on those premises. Functions conducted
7 under the authority of the permit shall be subject to the
8 following:

9 * * *

10 (3) each catered function shall last no longer than one day
11 and [not more than fifty-two] an unlimited number of catered
12 functions may be held each calendar year by each license holder
13 for use with a particular license;

14 * * *

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 2025.
