AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for
definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for
issuance and content of driver's license and for carrying and
exhibiting driver's license on demand; and, in fees, further
providing for driver's license and learner's permit.

- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The definition of "driver's license" in section
- 10 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is
- 11 amended and the section is amended by adding definitions to
- 12 read:
- 13 § 102. Definitions.
- 14 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 15 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 16 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 17 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
- 18 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:
- 19 * * *

- 1 "Data field." A discrete piece of information that is
- 2 <u>printed or otherwise appears on a driver's license or</u>
- 3 identification card issued under this title.
- 4 * * *
- 5 "Driver's license." A license or permit to drive a motor
- 6 vehicle issued under this title. The term includes a physical
- 7 driver's license or an electronic driver's license.
- 8 * * *
- 9 "Electronic driver's license." An electronic representation
- 10 of a physical driver's license which is viewable on an
- 11 <u>electronic product system.</u>
- 12 "Electronic identification card." An electronic
- 13 representation of a physical identification card which is
- 14 <u>viewable on an electronic product system.</u>
- 15 "Electronic product." An electronic representation of a
- 16 physical driver's license or physical identification card which
- 17 is viewable on an electronic product system.
- 18 "Electronic product device." A computer, tablet, smart phone
- 19 or other electronic personal device used by an electronic
- 20 product holder to access or display an electronic product or
- 21 electronic proof of financial responsibility.
- 22 * * *
- 23 "Full profile." All the data included on a physical driver's
- 24 license or physical identification card regarding the holder of
- 25 the physical driver's license or physical identification card.
- 26 * * *
- 27 "Identification card." A physical identification card or
- 28 electronic identification card issued by the department under
- 29 this title that identifies the individual to whom the card was
- 30 issued.

- 2 "Limited profile." An electronic representation created by
- 3 the department containing some, but not all, of the data fields
- 4 printed or otherwise displayed upon an individual's driver's
- 5 license or identification card issued under this title.
- 6 * * *
- 7 <u>"Physical driver's license." A driver's license issued under</u>
- 8 this title in a physical format, such as paper or plastic, that
- 9 <u>identifies the individual to whom the driver's license was</u>
- 10 issued.
- 11 "Physical identification card." An identification card
- 12 <u>issued under this title in a physical format, such as paper or</u>
- 13 plastic, that identifies the individual to whom the
- 14 identification card was issued.
- 15 * * *
- 16 <u>"Product holder." An individual to whom a driver's license</u>
- 17 or an identification card was issued under this title.
- 18 * * *
- 19 "Third-party electronic product system." As follows:
- 20 (1) An electronic product system that is not maintained
- 21 <u>by the department or by an agent acting on behalf of the</u>
- department.
- 23 (2) The term may include, without limitation, an
- 24 <u>electronic wallet.</u>
- 25 * * *
- 26 "Verification system." A computer system operated by the
- 27 <u>department or a person authorized by the department that is used</u>
- 28 to verify the authenticity and validity of electronic products
- 29 <u>issued under this title.</u>
- 30 "Verifier." A person that seeks to confirm information about

- 1 an electronic product holder via the department's verification
- 2 system and the electronic product's data fields.
- 3 * * *
- 4 Section 2. Section 1510 of Title 75 is amended by adding
- 5 subsections to read:
- 6 § 1510. Issuance and content of driver's license.
- 7 * * *
- 8 (k) Electronic driver's license.--
- 9 <u>(1) The department may issue an electronic driver's</u>
- 10 <u>license to an individual who has paid the annual access fee</u>
- 11 to an electronic credential system and who holds a physical
- 12 <u>driver's license issued under this title. The following</u>
- 13 <u>apply:</u>
- 14 (i) The department may create an electronic product
- 15 <u>system that the individual may access via an electronic</u>
- product device to display the individual's electronic
- 17 driver's license on the electronic product device.
- 18 <u>(ii) The department may not issue an electronic</u>
- 19 <u>driver's license to an individual unless the individual</u>
- 20 <u>holds a valid physical driver's license.</u>
- 21 (2) Only one electronic product may be issued to an
- 22 <u>individual</u>.
- 23 (3) The data fields in an electronic product shall match
- 24 <u>the data fields held by the department for the product holder</u>
- 25 at the time that the electronic product is issued. The
- 26 <u>following apply:</u>
- (i) Changes and updates to data fields held by the
- 28 <u>department shall be reflected in the data fields in the</u>
- 29 electronic product.
- 30 (ii) Within 30 days of updating the records of

Τ	individuals holding an electronic product, the department
2	shall update the data fields of the electronic products.
3	(iii) An electronic product device shall
4	periodically update with the department, not less than 30
5	days, the data fields on the individual's electronic
6	product device, to determine operating system and
7	application compliance and to update the data fields on
8	the electronic product.
9	(1) Electronic identification card The department may
10	issue an electronic identification card to an individual who has
11	paid the annual access fee to an electronic product system and
12	who holds a physical identification card issued under this
13	title. The following apply:
14	(1) The department may create an electronic product
15	system that the individual may access via an electronic
16	product device to display the individual's electronic
17	identification card on the electronic product device.
18	(2) The department may not issue an electronic
19	identification card to an individual unless the individual
20	holds a valid physical identification card.
21	(m) Regulations regarding electronic driver's licenses and
22	identification cards The department shall promulgate
23	regulations as necessary to issue and verify electronic products
24	issued under this title or by other government entities.
25	(n) Third-party electronic product systems
26	(1) The department may issue electronic products through
27	a third-party electronic product system.
28	(2) Prior to issuing electronic products through a
29	third-party electronic product system, the department shall
30	enter into an agreement with the owner of the third-party

1	electronic product system to protect the confidentiality of
2	the information contained in records held by the department
3	or the data fields of electronic credentials as required by
4	this title.
5	(o) Verification system
6	(1) The department shall develop a verification system
7	that shall operate when the department issues electronic
8	products.
9	(2) An individual who is issued an electronic product
10	may give consent to a verifier to verify information about
11	the individual as product holder via the department's
12	verification system. The following apply:
13	(i) The product holder shall determine which data
14	fields shall be made available to the verifier via the
15	product holder's electronic product device.
16	(ii) The product holder has discretion to make
17	either a full profile, a limited profile or no data
18	fields available to the verifier.
19	(iii) If there is a discrepancy between the
20	information on an individual's physical driver's license
21	or physical identification card and the information in a
22	verification from the department via the verification
23	system, the information from the verification system is
24	to be considered the more accurate and current
25	information.
26	(3) The department may enter into agreements with other
27	government entities that issue electronic credentials to
28	allow for verification of those credentials through the
29	department's verification system.
30	(4) The department may enter into agreements with other

Τ	governmental entitles and jurisdictions that operate a
2	similar verification system for the purpose of verifying
3	electronic products issued under this title.
4	(p) Medical-related indicator
5	(1) The department shall include a medical-related
6	indicator, designed by the department, on an electronic
7	product upon application by an individual. The application
8	shall include:
9	(i) A self-attestation that the individual:
10	(A) has a medical condition that could affect
11	communication or account for a medical emergency;
12	(B) is deaf or has a hearing impairment; or
13	(C) has a developmental disability.
14	(ii) A statement from the individual that the
15	individual has voluntarily provided the self-attestation
16	and other information verifying the individual's
17	condition.
18	(iii) For individuals under 18 years of age, the
19	signature of a parent, legal guardian, person in loco
20	parentis or spouse who is 18 years of age or older.
21	(iv) Any additional documentation required by the
22	<u>department.</u>
23	(2) A medical-related indicator shall only be accessed
24	by law enforcement or emergency personnel during an
25	interaction with law enforcement or in response to an
26	accident or emergency situation. The following apply:
27	(i) Information contained in a medical-related
28	indicator shall be kept confidential by law enforcement
29	and emergency personnel.
30	(ii) The inclusion of a medical-related indicator

- shall not be construed as a blanket waiver to an
- 2 <u>individual's right to privacy.</u>
- 3 Section 3. Section 1511 of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 4 § 1511. Carrying and exhibiting driver's license on demand.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- Every licensee shall possess a physical
- 6 driver's license issued to the licensee at all times when
- 7 driving a motor vehicle and shall exhibit the physical.gr/">physical.gr/ driver's
- 8 <u>license or an electronic driver's</u> license upon demand by a
- 9 police officer, and when requested by the police officer the
- 10 licensee shall write the licensee's name in the presence of the
- 11 officer in order to provide identity.
- 12 (b) Production to avoid penalty. -- No person shall be
- 13 convicted of violating this section or section 1501(a) (relating
- 14 to drivers required to be licensed) if the person:
- 15 (1) produces at the headquarters of the police officer
- who demanded to see the person's license, within 15 days of
- 17 the demand, a driver's license valid in this Commonwealth at
- 18 the time of the demand; or
- 19 (2) if a citation has been filed, produces at the office
- of the issuing authority, within 15 days of the filing of the
- 21 citation, a driver's license valid in this Commonwealth on
- 22 the date of the citation.
- 23 (c) No requirement to surrender electronic product device.--
- 24 A statute or regulation that requires an individual to surrender
- 25 <u>a driver's license or identification card to law enforcement</u>
- 26 does not apply to an electronic product device.
- 27 (d) Privacy of information on electronic product device.--If
- 28 <u>a licensee exhibits an electronic driver's license upon demand</u>
- 29 by a police officer under this section, the police officer may
- 30 review only the full profile of the product holder's electronic

- 1 <u>driver's license via the electronic product device. If the</u>
- 2 police officer inadvertently reviews information on the
- 3 electronic product device in addition to the licensee's full
- 4 profile, that information may not be used as evidence in any
- 5 civil or criminal action.
- 6 Section 4. Section 1951 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 7 subsection to read:
- 8 § 1951. Driver's license and learner's permit.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (e) Electronic product. -- The fee for an electronic product
- 11 shall be \$5 and shall be paid in addition to the other fees
- 12 <u>imposed in this section.</u>
- 13 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 15 months.
