A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Designating March 21, 2024, as "Rosie the Riveter Day" in Pennsylvania and honoring the service and contributions of the millions of women who entered the workforce during World
4	War II.
5	WHEREAS, During World War II, 16 million American men left
6	their jobs in order to fight the Axis powers around the world;
7	and
8	WHEREAS, Millions of vacant jobs were filled by women who
9	traditionally did not work in the manufacturing sector; and
10	WHEREAS, In an effort to recruit women into the workforce,
11	the Federal Government began a campaign that included magazine
12	articles appealing to women; and
13	WHEREAS, On the cover of the May 29, 1943, edition of the
14	Saturday Evening Post, Norman Rockwell illustrated the first
15	Rosie the Riveter; and
16	WHEREAS, The millions of women who helped to support the war
17	effort began to identify with Rosie the Riveter; and

1 WHEREAS, Among those identifying with this imagery were the 2 thousands of women from this Commonwealth who helped 3 Pennsylvania become "The Arsenal of America"; and WHEREAS, These women built ships at the Philadelphia Naval 4 Shipyard, assembled anti-aircraft guns at the Naval Ordnance 5 6 Plant in York, assisted with the production of heavy trucks at 7 the Mack Manufacturing Corporation in Allentown, overhauled 8 battle-worn airplanes at the Harrisburg Shops in Middletown and worked in the steel mills of Allegheny County; and 9 10 WHEREAS, During World War II, the working women of this Commonwealth and the United States saw Rosie the Riveter as an 11 12 icon of female patriotism and a symbol of what was necessary to 13 support the war effort on the home front; and 14 WHEREAS, In the fall of 2020, Congress passed and the 15 President signed into law the Rosie the Riveter Congressional 16 Gold Medal Act, which collectively awards the Congressional Gold Medal to all of the women who entered the workforce during World 17 18 War II and identify as Rosie the Riveter; therefore be it 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate March 21, 2024, as "Rosie the Riveter Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it 20 21 further

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the service 23 and contributions of the millions of women who entered the 24 workforce during World War II.
