OVERVIEW:

House Bill 209 codifies and consolidates the acts relating to prisons, probation and parole into Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes. The new consolidated Title 61 will be known as the "Prison and Parole Code."

The purpose of the Title 61 codification is to repeal acts that are obsolete, modernize terminology and clarify the law without making substantive changes.

The repeal of the acts relating to interstate compacts and incarceration of individuals on probation or parole in other states will become effective on the date Pennsylvania finalizes the interstate compact agreement for supervision of adult offenders. The remainder of the act will take effect on November 24, 2009.

ANALYSIS:

This bill is a codification of existing laws; it is not intended to make substantive changes. The enactment of House Bill 209 will have no negative fiscal impact to the Commonwealth or to counties.
