### OVERVIEW:

House Bill 557 would amend the Liquor Code to allow certain colleges and universities to obtain a wine auction permit for fundraising purposes. This bill also would clarify language regarding public officials and interests in liquor licenses.

This bill would take effect immediately.

### ANALYSIS:

This bill would allow for a wine auction permit to be issued to a college or university, which is located in a township of the second class in a third class county, for the purposes of fundraising. This bill also clarifies which public officials may hold interests in liquor licenses. Finally, this bill provides clarification for interlocking business interests with regard to manufacturers and retailers.

There is no negative fiscal impact on Commonwealth or local government funds as a result of this bill.
