OVERVIEW:

House Bill 1795 amends the Workforce Development Act to provide for the creation of youth councils within local workforce investment boards. Youth councils would include members of the local board with special interest or expertise in youth policy, representatives of youth service agencies, representatives of local public housing authorities, parents, individuals from organizations with experience related to youth activities, representatives of the job corps and members of the youth demographic who have leadership roles in their organizations.

This bill takes effect immediately.

ANALYSIS:

Although existing state law does not require youth councils, the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 requires them. House Bill 1795 mirrors the federal law, but adds "members of the youth demographic who maintain leadership roles in local youth organizations." Since the activities required by the bill are already in place, the Department of Labor and Industry believes that the bill can be carried out within existing resources. Therefore, there is no additional cost to the commonwealth as a result of this legislation.
