## **OVERVIEW:**

House Bill 2139 creates a Pennsylvania Agricultural Surplus System (PASS) under the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (PDA). The legislation authorizes the PDA to make contracts for development and operation of donated food products to Commonwealth's food assistance network and food banks.

The bill takes effect in 60 days.

## **ANALYSIS:**

The bill has no current fiscal year costs. The proposed PASS program will only be implemented to the extend State, Federal, and other funds are made available for the program by the General Assembly.

In 2007, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) had awarded PDA a small grant (\$50,000) to operate a federally funded pilot PASS program. This pilot provides a model for this PASS legislation. The program will link healthy surplus food from Pennsylvania's agriculture community/industry to needy citizens.
