OVERVIEW:

House Bill 2286 appropriates funds from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for expenses necessary to administer the Workmen's Compensation Act and the Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act. The bill also provides an appropriation from a restricted account within the fund for the Office of the Small Business Advocate under the Department of Community and Economic Development. These appropriations are for FY 2010/11.

This act shall take effect July 1, 2010 or immediately, whichever is later.

ANALYSIS:

The appropriation to Labor and Industry totals \$74,951,000, and the appropriation to the Office of the Small Business Advocate is in the amount of \$190,000. The total appropriations made by this bill are \$75,141,000.
