OVERVIEW:

Senate Bill 828 amends the act of May 23, 1945 (P.L.926, No.369), entitled Public Eating and Drinking Place Law, further providing for definitions for the sale of non-potentially hazardous food by non-profit organizations.

The bill takes effect 60 days after enactment.

ANALYSIS:

The bill has no fiscal year costs. It defines "potentially hazardous food" as published by the U.S. Department of Health, Food and Drug Administration. In addition, the bill only requires that organizations such as a volunteer ambulance or fire company, religious, charitable, fraternal, veterans, civic, and so forth, are to post a notice to the consumer when the food being served was prepared in a private home, not subject to public licensing or inspection.
