**SUMMARY**: Amends the Assessors Certification Act to include counties of the first class (Philadelphia). This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

**ANALYSIS**: This legislation would remove Section 11 of the Assessors Certification Act (Act 28 of 1992), which had exempted counties of the first class (Philadelphia) from the requirements of the Act. An assessor in Philadelphia would have a total of four years from the effective date of this act to become certified.

**FISCAL IMPACT**: This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth or the City of Philadelphia Funds. Any costs to the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs within the Department of State would be offset by the biennial licensure fee on each newly-certified assessor.
