SUMMARY: House Bill 378 amends Act 286 of 1941, known as the Civil Service Act, by requiring that at least one member of the Civil Service Commission must be a veteran. The effective date is 60 days after enactment.

ANALYSIS: The bill amends the Civil Service Act to further provide for definitions and makeup of the Civil Service Commission. Section 201 is amended to require that at least one member of the Civil Service Commission be a veteran. (While the Civil Service Act outlines various qualifications to consider, potential candidates currently appointed by the Governor are not required to be veterans.)

The bill defines veteran as "individual who served in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or National Guard, and who was honorably discharged or released from that service."

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
