SUMMARY: Requires licensees of all boards and commissions within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs to report felony, misdemeanor or any drug violation convictions to their licensing board. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends Act 48 of 1993 to require each holder of a license, registration, certificate or permit from a licensing board or commission within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA), to notify their licensing board within 30 days if the individual has been convicted, found guilty or pleaded nolo contendere or received probation without verdict or ARD, for any felony, misdemeanor or drug violation.

A criminal matter expunged by court order is not required to be reported.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
