SUMMARY:

House Bill 663 amends the Public School Code to specify that a child may not be disenrolled from a school in the event of a residency dispute until certain conditions are met.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 663 amends Article XIII – Pupils and Attendance – of the Public School Code to specify that a child may not be disenrolled from a school in the case of a residency dispute until the child's guardians have exhausted or declined to participate in the appeal process provided in the applicable grievance policy. A child may also be disenrolled pursuant to a court order. Guardians are entitled to information from the school district's liaison for homeless children and youth.

House Bill 663 takes effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 663 would have no fiscal impact on commonwealth funds. The costs of residency disputes are incurred by local school districts, and the impact by school district will vary depending on the number and complexity of appeals brought forth.
