SUMMARY:

House Bill 1067 allows qualified non-citizens to be teachers.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 1067, Printer's Number 1086 amends Article XI – Professional Employes and Article XII – Certification of Teachers of the Public School Code to allow the citizenship requirement for teachers to be waived and a state certificate to be issued if the qualified individual holds a valid immigrant visa, work visa, or employment authorization that allows the individual to work in the United States.

House Bill 1067 would take effect immediately.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of Education does not anticipate that House Bill 1067 would increase monitoring costs. Therefore, House Bill 1067 would have no adverse fiscal impact on commonwealth funds.

House Bill 1067 expands the pool of potential qualified teachers and would have no adverse fiscal impact on school entities.
