SUMMARY:

House Bill 1882 amends Title 63 (Professions and Occupations (State Licensed)) to allow for immediate revocation of a license, registration, certification or permit under certain conditions.

ANALYSIS:

This bill empowers licensing boards and licensing commissions to rescind a license, registration, certification, or permit issued by the board or commission if there is probable cause that it was issued based on false or fraudulent documentation. The board or commission shall offer 10 business days' notice of the rescission and permit the applicant the opportunity to demonstrate their license, registration, certification, or permit was not issued based on false or fraudulent documentation. This will occur at a post-rescission hearing within 20 days of the rescission. If the applicant demonstrates their license, registration, certification, or permit was not obtained using false or fraudulent documentation, the board or commission may not, absent new evidence, rescind the license, registration, certification, or permit.

This act shall take effect immediately.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This legislation would have no fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The Department of State does not anticipate an increased workload for staff.
