## DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 2286 appropriates funds from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the administration of the Workers' Compensation Act and the Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year 2010-2011 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of fiscal year 2009-2010.

The bill also appropriates \$190,000 from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development for the operation of that office for fiscal year 2010-2011.

The Act takes effect July 1, 2010, or immediately, whichever is later.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

For fiscal year 2010-2011, there will be \$74,951,000 appropriated to the Department of Labor and Industry from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund. Also for fiscal year 2010-2011, there will be \$190,000 appropriated to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development from the restricted revenue account within the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund.
