DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

The bill amends the definition of "wild animals" in the Game Code to specifically exclude a species or variation of swine, pig or boar, held in captivity. Thus, with the passage of this legislation, the Game Commission will cease to have any authority over swine, pigs or boar held in captivity.

It appears that captive swine, pigs and boar were under the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture prior to 2007. In 2007 however, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court ruled that captive swine, pigs and boar were under the jurisdiction of the Game Commission. Specifically removing captive swine, pigs and boars from the definition of "wild animals" in the Game Code would result in these animals being considered "domestic animals" under the Domestic Animals Act which falls within the Department of Agriculture's purview.

The Act takes effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact will result from the passage of this legislation. The Department of Agriculture will not incur additional costs due to the legislation's passage. The legislation does not require the Department to regulate wild boar hunting preserves.
