## DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 1842 amends the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act (Act 261 of 1978) by removing the requirement that a temporary graduate perfusionist license shall expire immediately upon notice that the licensee has failed the licensing examination.

This legislation will allow a graduate perfusionist to take a licensing examination more than one time before the temporary graduate license is revoked. Temporary graduate licenses are valid for two years.

This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

## FISCAL IMPACT

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
