And the best way that we can honor them is to never forget them and to never forget that for which they fought. Ruane Memorial Highway; designating the bridge crossing the Lackawanna River along 8th Avenue, also known as U.S. Business Route 6, in downtown Carbondale, Lackawanna County, as the 109th Infantry Bridge; designating State Bridge No. 53-0054-0290-0143 carrying S.R. 54 in

Mr. **THOMAS**. Mr. Speaker, I rise to urge members on both sides to support amendment 08095.

And what the amendment would do is to put a cap on how far consumers can go into debt. If we allow the statute to be open, the question of caps being open, then consumers can come away in worse situations than when they started out. So I think that we can follow the past practices of this body and be specific on how far we are prepared to go, and in this particular case, 2 percent is a reasonable cap on debt settlement situations.

The **SPEAKER** pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Ross, on the amendment.

Mr. **ROSS**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Although the maker of this amendment, I am sure, intended well by the people that were in debt, it actually works against them. In fact, it provides a perverse incentive for those that are involved in settling people's debts to settle as little of the debt as possible because it increases their compensation if they settle less of the debt. So if someone is trying to get out of debt, their debt settlement company will be actually working against them. And I would urge a negative vote because I am afraid that this particular amendment was drafted incorrectly.

The **SPEAKER** pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Thomas, for the second time on the amendment.

Mr. **THOMAS**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, there might be a minute situation where this might work against the consumer, but in the majority of situations, we will send a clear message that – we will send a clear message with a number of other States, with the Federal Trade Commission, and with a number of other places in saying that we cannot leave the door open on how much can be collected in these debt situations, and 2 percent is a reasonable amount.

We put 1 percent on check cashing. We have percentages in other situations involving these kinds of transactions. And so there is no reason to steer away from the path that we have gone down in these kinds of transactions. So I urge you at the end of the day, there are more people that are going to benefit from this cap than the number of people who might speculatively end up paying more than the 2 percent.

But at the end of the day, I think it is good policy to say to the people of Pennsylvania that we want specificity in these kinds of transactions. These kinds of transactions need to have some regulatory scheme. And so by capping 5 percent, you will strike a balance between the debtor, the debt settlement provider, and the consumer.

So I urge you to support the 5 percent, especially if you could not support the 2 percent. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The **SPEAKER** pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Ross, on the amendment.

Mr. **ROSS**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

(i.1) If the superintendent has a reasonable belief, at any time during the school year, that appropriate education may not be occurring in the home education program, he may, by certified mail, return receipt requested, require that the supervisor provide documentation required under subsection (e)(1) to the superintendent within 30 days of the superintendent's request.

The **SPEAKER** pro tempore. On that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Longietti.

Mr. **LONGIETTI**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this amendment makes a relatively simple change to the bill. The way the bill is set up, if the superintendent has a reasonable belief that a proper education is not occurring, then there is a hearing process that gets triggered for a review.

When I asked the question in committee, what is the basis of a reasonable belief, since the superintendent does not have any documents available, I was told that it can be a report from a neighbor. And so all my bill does is try to short-circuit unnecessary hearings. It gives the superintendent the ability, if they have that reasonable belief, to request a copy of the portfolio. Upon review of the portfolio, the superintendent can then decide and say, you know, there really is a proper education occurring here, there is no need for a hearing, and not request a hearing.

So without my amendment, it goes straight to a hearing. With my amendment, there is simply an opportunity to review the portfolio and then decide not to have the hearing if the proper education is occurring. So I urge an affirmative vote.

The **SPEAKER** pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Gillen, on the amendment.

Mr. **GILLEN**. Thank you very much, and I have enjoyed working with my colleague across the aisle on this important homeschool issue. I was refreshed by one of my colleagues across the aisle just a few moments ago who came over and indicated his support of the bill in general and his opposition specific to this amendment.

At any time during the school year, if a superintendent deems that there is not an appropriate education taking place, he has the liberty currently, and he will under this bill, to request the certification that an appropriate education is taking place.

We have established under PDE, the Pennsylvania Department of Education, specific guidelines with regard to the evaluators. These guidelines are already in place. These are psychologists, these are educators, these are certified teachers that are evaluating the portfolios of those in home education,

and certainly that system being in place, we need to trust those evaluators to do the job that they are certified to do. And I would recommend a "no" vote on amendment 7682.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. **ROEBUCK** offered the following amendment No. **A07683**:

Amend Bill, page 2, lines 25 through 30; page 3, lines 1 through 14, by striking out all of said lines on said pages

On the question,
Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On that question, the gentleman, Mr. Roebuck, is recognized.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment deletes the language that a supervisor/parent may issue a high school diploma. Under the bill, a high school diploma issued by a supervisor/parent has the same standing as a diploma issued by a school district, the State, or Department of Education approved homeschool diploma-granting organizations. It is possible that a supervisor/parent could be issued for a homeschool student based on an evaluation paid for by the parents, by persons of only 2 years of teaching and grading student work, and a person who is not certified to teach in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

We are in the process of raising standards for educating children in the Commonwealth, while this bill in fact lowers the standards that are to be applied for those graduating from homeschooling. The bill only requires that a homeschool student complete taking a minimum number of courses that equate to that standard that was replaced 20 years ago with more rigorous standards for all students in Pennsylvania.

The current law was enacted in a bipartisan effort led by former Democratic Representative Chairman of the Education Committee Ron Cowell and former Republican House Appropriations Chairman Joe Pitts. The current law balances the interests of parents to homeschool students to educate their children if they wish to, and it is the interest of the State to ensure that all students receive an appropriate education. The current law is working well. It maintains rigorous academic standards for high school diplomas.

The bottom line in all of this should be that we are affirming that there are basic standards which all students educated in this Commonwealth need to meet. We should not be changing those standards to allow anyone, basically anyone to affirm that a student has met those standards with no background, no qualifications, no standards, no certification to teach. That is wrong. That weakens the quality of education in Pennsylvania. We ought not to allow that to happen. I would ask for your favorable vote on this amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Gillen, on the amendment.

Mr. GILLEN. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

I appreciate my distinguished colleague from Philadelphia and his commitment to education.

The Democratic committee bill analysis recognizes a homeschool diploma if the following standards are met: 4 years of English, 3 years of math in high school, 3 years of science, 3 years of social studies – it goes on to talk about the arts and humanities. And so even my colleagues on the other side of the aisle certainly have had the opportunity to read the analysis of the bill.

We need to join other States and the 21st century when it comes to recognizing the distinguished work that goes on in home education. We currently are the only State in the United States which has a de facto graduation requirement, tests that are necessitated, and a standard and an evaluation system which does not acknowledge that with a diploma. It presents a barrier, as my colleague from Westmoreland County on the other side of the aisle has articulated to me, as well as his wife, creates a barrier to higher education, creates a barrier to PHEAA (Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency), and homeschool parents pay property taxes.

And indeed, the Democratic committee bill analysis indicates there is a standard established. The Pennsylvania Department of Education has a standard for evaluators. I articulated those earlier. There is no reason to reenumerate. There is a bar; it is set high. Homeschool parents who meet that bar, as well as their students, should receive an acknowledgement.

So I recommend a "no" vote on amendment 7683. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Roebuck, for the second time on his amendment.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Again the gentleman has gone back 20 years to a standard that we have not used in this State and suggests that that is an adequate standard. It is not.

Understand that what we are saying is that you must take a certain number of courses, and there is no reference here to actually passing those courses or meeting a standard of achievement. There is nothing in what the gentleman is saying or in the bill he proposes that talks about a standard that you must meet.

You take the courses, 20 courses, someone signs a certificate that you have completed your high school education. If that is what we want to do, then understand that is what we are doing. If that is what we want to set as a standard, maybe we ought to do that for everyone in this Commonwealth – get rid of any standards of quality. This lets someone sign a certificate, you have taken 20 courses, you have taken so many in English, math, social studies, and that is sufficient. That is not sufficient, Mr. Speaker, and I do not think this legislature believes that is sufficient or that we should set that as a standard for children in Pennsylvania.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Gillen, for the second time.

Mr. GILLEN. I thank my colleague from Philadelphia. He probably does not realize how much I enjoy his passion, both at a personal level and public exchange.

My daughter is seated behind me over here. She is 14 years of age and she just finished taking a standardized test that was required by State law, and those results were submitted to our school district. She has done that multiple times. So there is a bar that is set.

I examined in the 2006-2007 school year, and I will leave you with this, 22,136 homeschoolers. When a superintendent stepped in and it actually came to a hearing of 22, 136 homeschoolers, there were 12, 12 that were put up for hearing, and that is not to assume that they were deficient. So if we have got one of 1,800 homeschoolers who may need something remedial or needs additional attention, I say that is a number that I would be envious of and want to encourage in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

I once again encourage a "no" vote on 7683. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. On that question, the gentleman, Mr. Roebuck, is recognized.

Mr. ROEBUCK. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This amendment deletes the entire bill and adds language that amends the homeschool education law to require that a superintendent has 30 days from the date they receive the required school documentation portfolio of the homeschool student's academic work to notify parents of a homeschool student if the superintendent does not believe that the student is receiving an appropriate education. If the superintendent does not respond within 30 days, the portfolio is deemed approved. This amendment assumes the superintendent will fulfill their legal duty to ensure that all homeschool students in their school district are receiving an appropriate education.

In the discussion of this legislation in committee, one of the criticisms, strongest criticisms, was that superintendents do not do their job. This amendment will ensure that in fact they do

their job by setting clear limits that would in fact allow that if they do not do their job in a speedy and efficient manner, then their authority is overridden.

Understand that in this amendment, as in the previous one, it also requires that there be a body of information – a portfolio that is passed and reviewed. My colleague who is supporting this bill, who is the author of this bill, omits from this discussion, there is no requirement that any portfolio even be produced for the person who reviews the material and then signs that the student has done the job. How can you have the process going forward without someone qualified and in authority to at least review the substance of what has been done and affirm that it has been done in a proper manner? If indeed we are going to just delete that, why do we not just let everyone assume that you go to school, you do what you want to do, you might get a good education, you might not, you might take the course, you complete them, you might not. We should not open up this process of educating young people in this way.

If indeed there is a quality of performance as has been suggested in this debate, if indeed you are going to have a person reviewing it who is highly qualified to do that, trained to master's level in education, that is one thing. But is that the standard that we are saying that every reviewer has to do this? Or is it just saying that someone with 2 years of some kind of school experience equates in the same way in reviewing the performance of a student, someone who is not even qualified to teach in a classroom?

There ought to be a standard; the minimal standard certainly should be that a person at superintendent level has the opportunity to review the performance, has the opportunity to review the work, and I would say that is a fair standard that anyone should be able to meet and should indeed be something that we as a legislative body affirm. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman and recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Gillen, on the amendment.

Mr. GILLEN. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

Again I thank my colleague from Philadelphia.

I would be opposed to my own bill if there was not a standard. There are standards. The Pennsylvania Department of Education has delineated what the standards are. Certainly we could have another discussion at another time in another meeting about freshening up those standards, but to the satisfaction of the Department of Education up until now, having a clinical psychologist, a certified educator, a teacher review the portfolios – and yes, indeed portfolios still need to be produced. I talked to a gal out in the highway before I came in here. She has done 67 portfolios and faithfully submitted those to the evaluator. That will continue. And at any time from day one of the school year that a superintendent does not feel that an appropriate education is taking place, he could request that certification. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

However, I would just like to point out for the record that the budget bill that passed out of the House this past Wednesday relied upon \$180 million of funds from the Small Business First Fund and Machinery and Equipment Loan Fund, was taken out of those funds. I am concerned that the transfer of funds will have a negative effect on the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's ability to provide loans for businesses next year and in the future.

Mr. MILNE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I do appreciate the comments of the minority chair of the Appropriations Committee, and I certainly appreciate his support for the bill. I would just point out for the members' edification that this bill is focused on a reorganization of these programs, a reengineering, to try to get more efficient use out of these dollars to make this program a more streamlined process for businesses and to try to make Pennsylvania that much more of a business-friendly State and create more opportunities for job growth and revenue enhancement for the State so we can try to meet some of the gentleman's concerns for future budgets.

Anything we do with this bill in 1550 is merely an administrative framework that just makes the programs operate more efficiently and effectively. And the considerations that have been put into the bill, the framework that is in the bill will still be effective regardless of any dollar levels that are in any of these accounts. It is about using whatever dollars are there as efficiently and effectively as possible for the business community and for the best interest of the taxpayers of Pennsylvania. And again I thank the gentleman for his support for the bill.
