WEDNESDAY, January 25, 1995

The Senate met at 11 a.m., Eastern Standard Time.

The PRESIDENT (Lieutenant Governor Mark S. Schweiker) in the Chair.

PRAYER

The Chaplain, Reverend DON HAMILTON, Pastor of the Capital Area Christian Church, Enola, offered the following prayer:

Let us pray together.

Our dear Heavenly Father, we come to You this morning thankful for another day of life and another opportunity to serve and glorify Your name. Father, we greatly appreciate Your willingness to use us to accomplish Your purpose. We are well aware that apart from You, Father, we can do nothing. And Father, we certainly recognize that every good and perfect gift comes from You and we know and acknowledge that You have created everything and that You sustain everything that is.

pray that You will make these men and women as devoted and as skilled as Your servant Nehemiah so long ago. And Father, guide them on their mission and grant them the power to realize their vision. Father, we will come before You time and again and say, to God be the Glory; great things he hath done. Amen.
