SB 746 (Pr. No. 1078) -- The Senate proceeded to consideration of the bill, entitled:

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for physician immunity for disclosure on controlled substances; and further providing for actions on insurance policies.
