

**SUPPLEMENTARY ACT**

**A SUPPLEMENT**

To an act approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred nine, entitled "An act to regulate the practice of osteopathy in the State of Pennsylvania; to provide for the establishment of a State Board of Osteopathic Examiners; to define the powers and duties of said Board of Osteopathic Examiners; to provide for the examining and licensing of osteopaths in this State; and to provide penalties for the violation of this act."

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That any candidate for license to practice osteopathy in Pennsylvania, who shall present his application to the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, and shall show to the satisfaction of the board that he was, before the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred twelve, a graduate from a legally incorporated and reputable college of osteopathy, and that the standard of requirements for graduation in such college, at the time of his graduation, was substantially the same as provided in section eight of the act to which this act is a supplement, shall be eligible to license under all the provisions of this act, in the same manner as candidates for license to practice osteopathy who made application prior to the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred twelve.
