MUNICIPAL SUITS, COUNSEL FEES Act of Apr. 22, 1929, P.L. 630, No. 263 AN ACT

Providing for the payment of counsel fees out of moneys recovered for counties, townships, boroughs, school districts, or poor districts, upon appeals from the county auditors' settlements of the accounts of public officers.

Be it enacted, &c., That when an appeal is taken from the county auditors' report or settlement of the account of any public officer, in accordance with the laws relating thereto, and such appeal results favorable to the appellants in such a manner that money is recovered for any county, township, borough, school district, or poor district, the court hearing such appeal shall make an order to pay a counsel fee, which it deems just and reasonable, to the counsel representing such appeal, out of the funds so recovered.

Section 2. This act shall apply to all such cases now pending or hereafter brought in any court of this Commonwealth.
