

**JURY COMMISSIONERS, COMPENSATION AND MILEAGE**  
**Act of May 4, 1933, P.L. 276, No. 99**

AN ACT

Fixing the compensation and mileage of jury commissioners in counties of the sixth class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That hereafter the compensation of the jury commissioners in counties of the sixth class shall be six dollars per diem for each and every day, not exceeding sixty-five days in any year, necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties, together with six cents per mile circular from and to their homes once each and every week so employed.

Section 2. The act approved the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand six hundred thirty-four), entitled "An act fixing the compensation and mileage of auditors and jury commissioners in counties of the sixth class," is hereby repealed in so far as it fixes the compensation of jury commissioners in counties of the sixth class.
