NATIONAL EMPLOYMENT SYSTEM

AN ACT

Accepting the provisions of an act of Congress for the establishment of a national employment system and authorizing the Department of Labor and Industry to cooperate with the Federal Employment Service under that act, and providing for the custody and disbursement of funds granted to the Commonwealth by the Federal Government thereunder.

Whereas, The Congress of the United States has passed an act, approved by the President June sixth, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, entitled "An act to provide for the establishment of a national employment system and for cooperation with the States in the promotion of such system, and for other purposes"; and

Whereas, It is provided in section five of the said act that the grants of money therein authorized shall be paid to each State which, by action of its Legislature, shall accept the provisions of the act, and designate or authorize the creation of a State agency which shall have the authority to cooperate with the United States Employment Service under the act.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby accepts the provisions of the act of Congress of June sixth, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, entitled "An act to provide for the establishment of a national employment system and for cooperation with the States in the promotion of such system, and for other purposes."

Section 2. The Department of Labor and Industry of this Commonwealth is hereby designated as the State agency to cooperate with the United States Employment Service under said act of Congress, and said department shall have full authority to do all things necessary to effect such cooperation.

Section 3. All moneys granted to the Commonwealth by the Federal Government, under the said act of Congress, shall be received by the State Treasurer as custodian, and he shall disburse such funds, on requisition of the Department of Labor and Industry, for the purposes of the grant without further appropriation.
