BOARD AND COMMISSION COMPENSATION LAW

Act of Sep. 2, 1961, P.L. 1177, No. 525

AN ACT

Fixing the salaries and compensation of members of certain boards and commissions, and repealing inconsistent acts. Compiler's Note: Section 2 of Act 51 of 1998 provided that Act 525 is repealed insofar as it established salaries for the chairman and members of the Securities Commission. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1.
