PART I  
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the General  
Appropriation Act of 2017.

Section 102. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall  
have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  
context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
other assistants in any department, board or commission.

"Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and  
telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and  
notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,  
light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,  
repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and  
facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on  
workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of  
liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment  
insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on  
employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee  
group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth  
share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation  
costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or  
additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental  
costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of  
General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of  
automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned  
automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred  
through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall  
include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State  
institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside  
hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution  
pay more for patient care than that provided under the State  
medical assistance program.

 46 or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically  
 47 appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter  
 48 named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial  
 49 Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,  
 50 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly  
 51 elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth,

1 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for  
2 the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
3 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
4 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
5 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
6 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
7 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
8 2017, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
9 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

10 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in  
11 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
12 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the  
13 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department  
14 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
15 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
16 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
17 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
18 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as  
19 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
20 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
21 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
22 2017, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
23 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

24 (c) Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth  
25 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
26 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to  
27 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of  
28 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
29 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
30 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
31 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
32 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as  
33 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
34 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
35 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
36 2017, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

46 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of  
47 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary  
48 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities  
49 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year  
50 beginning July 1, 2017, and for the payment of bills incurred  
51 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June

2 (e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The  
3 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
4 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
5 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several  
6 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the  
7 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services  
8 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and  
9 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by  
10 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,  
11 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set  
12 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and for the  
13 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
14 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

19 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
20 2017, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

29 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
30 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of  
31 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary  
32 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities  
33 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year

46 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as  
47 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
48 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
49 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

7 (y) ABLE Savings Program Fund.--The following sums set forth  
8 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
9 specifically appropriated from the ABLE Savings Program Fund to  
10 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of  
11 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
12 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
13 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
14 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
15 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as  
16 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
17 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
18 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

21 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.

22 The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth

34 (a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this

38 of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions  
39 for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning

41 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small  
42 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small  
43 cities and communities that have a high concentration of  
44 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their  
45 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet  
46 community development needs.

47 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services  
48 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and  
49 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on  
50 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the  
51 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In

1 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old  
2 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements  
3 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to  
4 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

5 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The  
6 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is  
7 for the provision of preventive health and other health services  
8 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,  
9 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health  
10 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic  
11 violence services.

12 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The  
13 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to  
14 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in  
15 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for  
16 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with  
17 special health care needs and in providing health services for  
18 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health  
19 care.

20 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-  
21 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help  
22 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income  
23 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for  
24 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds  
25 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds  
26 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds  
27 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

28 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block  
29 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible  
30 persons.

31 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health  
32 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of  
33 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with  
34 serious emotional disturbance.

35 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block  
36 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs  
37 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

38 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child  
39 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the  
40 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and  
41 availability of child care for low-income families.

42 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--  
43 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)  
44 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,  
45 training and support services, child welfare and administration  
46 for eligible families and individuals.

47 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education  
48 Assistance Agency.

49 The appropriations set forth in this act to the Pennsylvania  
50 Higher Education Assistance Agency, which is an integral part  
51 and arm of the Commonwealth and which is directly controlled by

1 the Commonwealth, shall supplement other Commonwealth funds  
2 maintained by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance  
3 Agency in order to fulfill its essential State governmental  
4 function of providing Commonwealth students with access to  
5 higher education opportunities and providing essential higher  
6 education programs for the benefit of Commonwealth students.

Section 2110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment Commission.

The appropriation made in this act or in any other fiscal year to the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining unexpended and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of Representatives, be transferred to any other account of the Senate and the House of Representatives, as they deem necessary.

Section 2111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant.

The Department of Health and Human Services shall allocate and disburse appropriations in this act for the Human Services Block Grant Pilot Program established under Article XIV-B of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, to counties participating in that program. Each such county may adjust the expenditure of its Human Services Block Grant Pilot Program allocation between those appropriations in accordance with, and as authorized by, the applicable provision of Article XIV-B of the Human Services Code.

PART XXII  
EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 2201. Retroactivity.

If this section takes effect after July 1, 2017, this act shall apply retroactively to July 1, 2017.

Section 2202. Effective date.

This act shall take effect as follows:

- (1) This section shall take effect immediately.
- (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, 2017, or immediately, whichever is later.
