1 Amend Bill, page 2, line 15, by striking out "assessment" and
2 inserting

3 State achievement test

4 Amend Bill, page 3, by inserting between lines 25 and 26

5 "State achievement test." The Pennsylvania System of School
6 Assessment test, the Keystone Exam, an equivalent local
7 assessment or another test established or approved by the State
8 Board of Education or the General Assembly to meet the
9 requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i), or required under the
10 Every Student Succeeds Act (Public Law 114-95, 129 Stat. 1802)
11 or its successor statute or another test required to achieve
12 other standards established by the department for the public
13 school or school district under 22 Pa. Code § 403.3 (relating to
14 single accountability system).

15 Amend Bill, page 4, lines 4 through 8, by striking out all of
16 said lines and inserting

17 (1) resides within the attendance area of a low-
18 achieving public school and:

19 (i) has been enrolled in a public school in this
20 Commonwealth for not less than one full semester
21 immediately preceding the establishment of an education
22 savings account; or

23 (ii) is entering kindergarten or the first grade.

24 Amend Bill, page 4, line 9, by striking out "(3)" and

27 Amend Bill, page 6, by inserting between lines 19 and 20

28 (k) Application and renewal period.--

29 (1) A parent may apply or seek renewal between January 1
30 and April 1 for the following school year.

31 (2) The department shall notify parents and school

districts of approved applications by April 30.

Amend Bill, page 13, line 4, by striking out the period after
"school" and inserting

, if the number of children meets the minimum number
required by the department for reporting of public school
scores.

Amend Bill, page 14, lines 2 through 5, by striking out all
of said lines and inserting

(a) General rule.--A resident school district shall provide
a participating entity that has admitted an eligible student
participating in the program with a complete copy of the
student's disciplinary record at the request of the
participating entity.

(b) Time period.--The resident school district shall supply
a certified copy of the student's disciplinary record, not later
than 10 days after receipt of the request, subject to the Family
Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Public Law 90-247,
20 U.S.C. § 1232g).
