Suspension of operating privilege for failure to 35 respond to citation. 36 Violations within Commonwealth. -- The department shall (a) suspend the operating privilege of any person who has failed to 37 respond to a citation or summons to appear before an issuing 38 39 authority or a court of competent jurisdiction of this Commonwealth for any violation of this title, other than 40 41 parking, or who has failed to pay any fine, costs or restitution

imposed by an issuing authority or such courts for violation of this title, other than parking, upon being duly notified by an issuing authority or a court of this Commonwealth. <u>An issuing</u> <u>authority or court shall notify the department that a person has</u> <u>failed to pay any fine, costs or restitution only after making a</u> <u>preliminary finding of non-indigency and a willful failure to</u> <u>pay without causing manifest hardship.</u>

8 (b) Violations outside Commonwealth.--The department shall 9 suspend the operating privilege of any person who has failed to respond to a citation, summons or similar writ to appear before 10 11 a court of competent jurisdiction of the United States or any 12 state which has entered into an enforcement agreement with the department, as authorized under section 6146 (relating to 13 enforcement agreements), for any violation of the motor vehicle 14 15 laws of such state, other than parking, or who has failed to pay any fine or costs imposed by such court upon being duly notified 16 17 in accordance with the laws of such jurisdiction in which the violation occurred. A person who provides proof, satisfactory to 18 the department, that the full amount of the fine and costs has 19 20 been forwarded to and received by the court shall not be regarded as having failed to respond for the purposes of this 21 22 subsection. The department shall not suspend the operating privilege of a person who has failed to pay a fine or costs 23 unless an issuing authority or court has first made a 24 25 preliminary finding of non-indigency and a willful failure to pay without causing manifest hardship. 26 * * * 27
