(vii) A court, issuing authority, senior judge or senior magisterial district judge may deviate from the maximum monthly payment plans under this paragraph only if it finds by a preponderance of the evidence presented at the hearing that the defendant has the present ability to pay a higher amount per month without experiencing a manifest hardship.

Section 2. Sections 1533(a) and (b) and 6504 of Title 75 are amended to read:
§ 1533. Suspension of operating privilege for failure to respond to citation.
(a) Violations within Commonwealth.--The department shall suspend the operating privilege of any person who has failed to respond to a citation or summons to appear before an issuing authority or a court of competent jurisdiction of this Commonwealth for any violation of this title, other than parking, or who has failed to pay any fine, costs or restitution
imposed by an issuing authority or such courts for violation of this title, other than parking, upon being duly notified by an issuing authority or a court of this Commonwealth. An issuing authority or court shall notify the department that a person has failed to pay any fine, costs or restitution only after making a preliminary finding of non-indigency and a willful failure to pay without causing manifest hardship.
(b) Violations outside Commonwealth.--The department shall suspend the operating privilege of any person who has failed to respond to a citation, summons or similar writ to appear before a court of competent jurisdiction of the United States or any state which has entered into an enforcement agreement with the department, as authorized under section 6146 (relating to enforcement agreements), for any violation of the motor vehicle laws of such state, other than parking, or who has failed to pay any fine or costs imposed by such court upon being duly notified in accordance with the laws of such jurisdiction in which the violation occurred. A person who provides proof, satisfactory to the department, that the full amount of the fine and costs has been forwarded to and received by the court shall not be regarded as having failed to respond for the purposes of this subsection. The department shall not suspend the operating privilege of a person who has failed to pay a fine or costs unless an issuing authority or court has first made a preliminary finding of non-indigency and a willful failure to pay without causing manifest hardship.
