^{49 (}a) Prohibition.--[No driver shall operate a motor vehicle 50 on a highway or trafficway in this Commonwealth while using an 51 interactive wireless communications device to send, read or

write a text-based communication while the vehicle is in motion. A person does not send, read or write a text-based communication 3 when the person reads, selects or enters a telephone number or name in an interactive wireless communications device for the purpose of activating or deactivating a voice communication or a telephone call.

- Seizure. -- The provisions of this section shall not be construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of an interactive wireless communications device, unless otherwise provided by law.
- Penalty. -- A person who violates subsection (a) commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50.
- (e) Preemption of local ordinances. -- In accordance with section 6101 (relating to applicability and uniformity of title), this section supersedes and preempts all ordinances of any municipality with regard to the use of an interactive wireless communications device by the driver of a motor vehicle.
- Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "textbased communication" means a text message, instant message, electronic mail or other written communication composed or received on an interactive wireless communications device.] Except as provided in subsection (c), a driver may not engage in texting while driving a motor vehicle.
- (b) Employer. -- Except as provided under subsection (c), an employer may not permit or require a driver of the employer to engage in texting while driving a motor vehicle.
- (c) Emergency use exception. -- Texting while driving shall be permissible by a driver of a motor vehicle if necessary to communicate with a law enforcement official or other emergency services to prevent injury to persons or property.
- (d) Penalties. -- Except as provided for in subsection (e), a person who violates this section commits a summary offense. The following shall apply:
 - (1) For a first conviction with no conviction of and no plea of no contest accepted to a charge of violating this section within the previous 60-month period, as measured from the dates any previous convictions were obtained or pleas of no contest were accepted to the date the current conviction is obtained or plea of no contest is accepted, a fine of not more than \$150 shall be imposed.
 - (2) For a second conviction within a 60-month period of time, as measured from the dates any previous convictions were obtained or pleas of no contest were accepted to the date the current conviction is obtained or plea of no contest is accepted, a fine of not more than \$250.
 - (3) For a third or subsequent conviction within a 60month period of time, as measured from the dates any previous convictions were obtained or pleas of no contest were accepted to the date the current conviction is obtained or

plea of no contest is accepted, a fine of not more than $500, two points and suspension of the offender's driver's license for a period of 60 days shall be imposed.
```

- (e) Warning period. -- For the first 12 months after the effective date of this subsection, a driver who violates subsection (a) may only be issued a written warning for a violation.
- (f) Law enforcement education.--The department, in consultation with the Pennsylvania State Police, shall develop and electronically distribute education materials for law enforcement on how to effectively detect distracted drivers, regardless of age, sex, race or ethnicity, who violate this section.
- (g) Prohibition on similar citations.--A person may not be charged with a violation of section 3316.1 (relating to prohibiting use of interactive mobile device) concurrently with a violation of subsection (a) for an offense committed at the same time and place.
- (h) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Driving." Operating a motor vehicle on a highway, including while the motor vehicle is temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control device or other momentary delay. The term does not include operating a motor vehicle if the driver moved the vehicle to the side of or off of a highway and halted in a location where the vehicle can safely remain stationary.

"Electronic device." The term includes, but is not limited to, a cellular telephone, personal digital assistant, pager, computer or any other device used to input, write, send, receive or read text or images.

"Texting." Manually entering alphanumeric text into or reading text from an electronic device. The following shall apply:

- (1) The term includes, but is not limited to, short message service, emailing, instant messaging, a command or request to access an Internet web page, pressing more than a single button to initiate or terminate a voice communication using a mobile telephone or engaging in any other form of electronic text retrieval or entry, for present or future communication.
 - (2) The term does not include:
 - (i) Inputting, selecting or reading information on a global positioning system or navigation system.
 - (ii) Pressing a single button to initiate or terminate a voice communication using a mobile telephone.
 - (iii) Using a device capable of performing multiple functions, including fleet management systems, dispatching devices, citizens band radios and music players, for a purpose that is not prohibited by this section.
