Valid certification to use medical marijuana under the Medical Marijuana Act shall not, in and of itself, be 19 sufficient evidence for a conviction under this section. 20 (1.2) (i) A medical marijuana patient convicted of 21 operating a vehicle while impaired to a degree that the 2.2 23 individual is unable to safely drive, operate or be in actual physical control of the vehicle shall be penalized 24 25 under section 3804(c) (relating to penalties). 26 (ii) Possession of a medical marijuana patient 27 identification card shall not, in and of itself, be sufficient to establish probable cause to charge the 2.8 individual with a violation of this section. 29 30 (iii) Possession of a medical marijuana patient 31 identification card shall not, in and of itself, establish reasonable grounds to request a chemical test 32 33 under section 1547 (relating to chemical testing to

(iv) Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to

1 supersede Federal regulation of the licensing and
2 operation of commercial vehicles and school vehicles.
