## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for registration and
- 3 transfer of firearm.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 6106.2. Registration and transfer of firearm.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- Any person who lawfully possesses a
- 10 firearm, prior to 90 days after the effective date of this
- 11 section, shall register the firearm within one year of that
- 12 <u>effective date with the commissioner under those procedures</u>
- 13 which the Pennsylvania State Police may establish. The
- 14 registration shall contain a description of the firearm that
- 15 identifies it uniquely, including all identification marks, the
- 16 full name, address, date of birth and thumbprint of the owner
- 17 and any other information as the Pennsylvania State Police may
- 18 deem appropriate. The Pennsylvania State Police may charge a fee

- 1 for registration of up to \$20 per person but not to exceed the
- 2 <u>actual processing costs of the Pennsylvania State Police.</u>
- 3 (b) Certain sales, transfers, etc.--No firearm possessed
- 4 <u>under this section may be sold or transferred on or after 90</u>
- 5 days following the effective date of this section to anyone
- 6 within this Commonwealth other than to a licensed gun dealer.
- 7 Any person who obtains title to a firearm registered under this
- 8 section by bequest or intestate succession and moves into this
- 9 Commonwealth in lawful possession of a firearm shall, within 90
- 10 days, either register the firearm, render the weapon permanently
- 11 inoperable, sell the weapon to a licensed gun dealer or remove
- 12 <u>the weapon from this Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
