## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania
  - Consolidated Statutes, further providing for termination of
- 3 utility service.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1406(f) of Title 66 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 1406. Termination of utility service.
- 9 \* \* \*

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- 10 (f) Medical certification. -- A public utility shall not
- 11 terminate service to a premises when a licensed physician or
- 12 nurse practitioner has certified that the customer or a member
- 13 of the customer's household is seriously ill or afflicted with a
- 14 medical condition that will be aggravated by cessation of
- 15 service. The customer shall obtain a letter from a licensed
- 16 physician verifying the condition and shall promptly forward it

- to the public utility. The maximum length of a certificate shall 1
- 2 <u>be 90 days unless otherwise specified by the medical</u>
- certificate. The medical certification procedure shall be 3
- 4 implemented in accordance with commission regulations.

- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 6
