A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of May 7 through 13, 2017, as "National Travel and Tourism Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The week of May 7 through 13, 2017, has been
- 4 selected as "National Travel and Tourism Week" by the U.S.
- 5 Travel Association; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "National Tourism Week" was established in 1983 when
- 7 the Congress of the United States passed a joint resolution
- 8 designating a week in May 1984 as "National Tourism Week" and,
- 9 in a White House ceremony, the President of the United States
- 10 signed a Presidential proclamation urging citizens to observe
- 11 the week with appropriate ceremonies and activities; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Tourism is one of Pennsylvania's largest industries
- 13 and a major contributor to the economy of this Commonwealth,
- 14 accounting for an annual economic impact of nearly \$41 billion;

- WHEREAS, Tourism supports a work force of more than 498,000
- 3 people, with approximately 1 out of every 16 Pennsylvania jobs
- 4 relying on travel and tourism and related industries; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is one of the most-visited states in
- 6 the country, with an estimated 193 million domestic visits
- 7 annually; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize May 7
- 9 through 13, 2017, as "National Travel and Tourism Week" in
- 10 Pennsylvania.
