A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring Snyder County on its 150th anniversary.

2 WHEREAS, First settled in the 1740s by Pennsylvania Germans
3 from Berks and Lebanon Counties, the area now known as Snyder
4 County became an independent political unit on March 2, 1855;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, The county adopted its name from a famous native
7 son, Simon Snyder, who served three terms as Governor of the
8 Commonwealth, was a member of the State Senate and the State
9 House of Representatives and held the post of Speaker of the
10 House from 1802 to 1808; and

11 WHEREAS, Snyder County has had a rich history and has grown
12 and flourished to become famous for its Pennsylvania German

1 heritage and culture; and

2 WHEREAS, It is also famous for its agricultural economy, its
3 historic structures and its academic commitment; therefore be it

4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor Snyder
5 County on its 150th anniversary.
