A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing November 16, 2017, as "The Great American Smokeout Day" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, Smoking, secondhand smoke and broader tobacco 3
- marketing were commonplace in the 1970s when annual Great
- 5 American Smokeout events were first observed; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Today more than 36 million people in the United
- 7 States smoke cigarettes and millions more smoke tobacco in
- 8 cigars or pipes; and
- WHEREAS, Tobacco use remains the single largest preventable
- cause of disease and premature death in the United States; and 10
- 11 WHEREAS, Cigarette smoking is believed to cause approximately
- 12 1 in 5 deaths in the United States each year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Exposure to secondhand smoke alone causes an
- 14 estimated 41,000 deaths per year among adults in the United
- 15 States; and
- WHEREAS, Including secondhand smoke, cigarette smoking causes 16

- 1 more than 480,000 deaths annually; and
- 2 WHEREAS, According to the National Youth Tobacco Survey, 3.9
- 3 million middle and high school students used tobacco in 2016;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2016, according to the National Youth Tobacco
- 6 Survey, 47.2% of high school tobacco users and 42.4% of middle
- 7 school tobacco users used two or more different types of tobacco
- 8 products; and
- 9 WHEREAS, E-cigarettes remain the most commonly used tobacco
- 10 product among youths for the last three years; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Millions of Americans are living with serious
- 12 tobacco-related illnesses; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Cigarette smoking increases the risk of cancers of
- 14 the mouth and throat, lung, esophagus, pancreas, cervix, kidney,
- 15 bladder, stomach, colon, rectum and liver, as well as acute
- 16 myeloid leukemia; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Smoking also greatly increases the risk of
- 18 debilitating, long-term lung diseases such as emphysema and
- 19 chronic bronchitis; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Smoking raises the risk for heart attack, stroke,
- 21 blood vessel diseases and eye diseases; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Half of all smokers who keep smoking will eventually
- 23 die from a smoking-related illness; and
- 24 WHEREAS, A smoker's heart rate and blood pressure drop just
- 25 20 minutes after quitting smoking; and
- 26 WHEREAS, One year after quitting smoking, the excess risk of
- 27 coronary heart disease is half that of someone who still smokes,
- 28 and the risk of heart attack drops dramatically; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Fifteen years after quitting smoking, a smoker's
- 30 risk of coronary heart disease is equivalent to the risk for a

- 1 nonsmoker; and
- 2 WHEREAS, No matter how old a smoker is or how long the
- 3 individual has been a smoker, quitting can help them live
- 4 longer, healthier lives; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Sponsored by the American Cancer Society, The Great
- 6 American Smokeout is held each year on the third Thursday of
- 7 November to create awareness of addiction and tobacco-related
- 8 diseases and deaths while promoting further regulation of
- 9 tobacco products and helping smokers quit; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Research has shown that smokers have greater success
- 11 quitting smoking when they have appropriate support; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Smoking cessation is more readily attained when
- 13 smokers use two or more of these recommended measures: support
- 14 groups, online groups, counseling, nicotine replacement,
- 15 prescription medicine, quide books and encouragement from
- 16 friends and family members; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives, noting the dangers of
- 18 tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke, is committed to
- 19 the prevention and cessation of smoking and other tobacco use;
- 20 therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
- 22 November 16, 2017, as "The Great American Smokeout Day" in
- 23 Pennsylvania.
