A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of May 2004 as "Amyotrophic Lateral
- 2 Sclerosis Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and urging the
- 3 President and Congress of the United States to enact
- 4 legislation to provide additional funding for research in
- 5 order to find a treatment and a cure for ALS.
- 6 WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) is better known
- 7 as Lou Gehrig's disease; and
- 8 WHEREAS, ALS is a fatal neurodegenerative disease
- 9 characterized by degeneration of cell bodies of the lower motor
- 10 neurons in the gray matter of the anterior horns of the spinal
- 11 cord; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The initial symptom of ALS is weakness of the
- 13 skeletal muscles, especially those of the extremities; and
- 14 WHEREAS, As ALS progresses, the patient experiences
- 15 difficulty in swallowing, talking and breathing; and
- 16 WHEREAS, ALS eventually causes muscles to atrophy, and the

- 1 patient becomes a functional quadriplegic; and
- WHEREAS, ALS does not affect a patient's mental capacity, so
- 3 a patient remains alert and aware of the loss of motor functions
- 4 and the inevitable outcome of continued deterioration and death;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, ALS occurs in adulthood, most commonly between the
- 7 ages of 40 and 70, with the peak age about 55, and affects men
- 8 two to three times more often than women; and
- 9 WHEREAS, More than 5,000 new ALS patients are diagnosed
- 10 annually; and
- 11 WHEREAS, On average, patients diagnosed with ALS survive two
- 12 to five years from the time of diagnosis; and
- 13 WHEREAS, ALS has no known cause, prevention or cure; and
- 14 WHEREAS, "Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) Awareness
- 15 Month" will increase public awareness of ALS patients'
- 16 circumstances, acknowledge the terrible impact this disease has
- 17 on patients and families and recognize the research for
- 18 treatment and cure of ALS; therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania recognize the month of May 2004 as
- 21 "Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) Awareness Month" in
- 22 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 24 President and Congress of the United States to enact legislation
- 25 to provide additional funding for ALS research; and be it
- 26 further
- 27 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 28 the President of the United States, to the Vice President of the
- 29 United States, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
- 30 to the members of Congress from Pennsylvania and to the United

1 States Secretary of Health and Human Services.
