## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), entitled "An 2 act providing for the planning and regulation of solid waste 3 storage, collection, transportation, processing, treatment, 4 and disposal; requiring municipalities to submit plans for municipal waste management systems in their jurisdictions; authorizing grants to municipalities; providing regulation of 6 7 the management of municipal, residual and hazardous waste; 8 requiring permits for operating hazardous waste and solid 9 waste storage, processing, treatment, and disposal facilities; and licenses for transportation of hazardous 10 waste; imposing duties on persons and municipalities; 11 12 granting powers to municipalities; authorizing the 13 Environmental Quality Board and the Department of 14 Environmental Resources to adopt rules, regulations, 15 standards and procedures; granting powers to and imposing duties upon county health departments; providing remedies; 16 17 prescribing penalties; and establishing a fund, " further 18 providing for certain facility siting and for approval by 19 governing body. 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), known 22 23 as the Solid Waste Management Act, is amended by adding a
- 25 <u>Section 104.1. Facility siting.</u>

section to read:

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26 (a) The department shall, within two years of the effective

- 1 date of this section, adopt regulations for the siting of
- 2 <u>municipal</u>, <u>residual</u> and <u>hazardous</u> <u>waste</u> <u>treatment</u>, <u>processing</u> or
- 3 <u>disposal facilities</u>, which criteria shall include, but not be
- 4 limited to, specific restrictions and limitations on the siting
- 5 of a municipal, residual or hazardous waste facility:
- 6 (1) Within a five-mile radius of any existing or
- 7 proposed municipal, residual or hazardous waste facility.
- 8 (2) Within a two-mile radius of any public facility or
- 9 <u>building which is owned by a school district or a private or</u>
- 10 parochial school.
- 11 (3) Within a two-mile radius of any airport, community
- 12 park, hospital, church, retail center or nursing home.
- 13 (4) Within a two-mile radius of any prison or facility
- in which individuals are involuntarily incarcerated.
- (b) Such regulations shall consider and address the
- 16 environmental, economic and societal impacts of the siting of
- 17 <u>facilities as described in subsection (a)(1), (2), (3) and (4).</u>
- 18 Section 2. Section 504 of the act is amended to read:
- 19 Section 504. Approval by governing body.
- 20 (a) Applications for a permit shall be reviewed by the
- 21 appropriate county, county planning agency or county health
- 22 department where they exist and the host municipality, and they
- 23 may recommend to the department conditions upon, revisions to,
- 24 or disapproval of the permit only if specific cause is
- 25 identified. In such case the department shall be required to
- 26 publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin its justification for
- 27 overriding the county's recommendations. If the department does
- 28 not receive comments within 60 days, the county shall be deemed
- 29 to have waived its right to review.
- 30 (b) At the request of a county within which a facility is to

- 1 <u>be located</u>, the department may reimburse the county for costs
- 2 <u>incurred for an independent permit application review including</u>
- 3 <u>a review of the environmental, health, economic and social</u>
- 4 impacts at the facility, by a professional engineer who is
- 5 <u>licensed in this Commonwealth and who has previous experience in</u>
- 6 preparing such permit applications, of an application under this
- 7 <u>act, for a new municipal waste landfill or resource recovery</u>
- 8 facility or that would result in additional capacity for a
- 9 <u>municipal waste landfill or resource recovery facility.</u>
- 10 Reimbursement shall not exceed \$10,000 per complete application.
- 11 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
