AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for tuition credit
- 3 for children of deceased soldiers.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3503 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 3503. Tuition credit for children and spouses of deceased
- 9 soldiers.
- 10 (a) [General rule] Children.--The children of members of the
- 11 Pennsylvania National Guard who were killed or die as a result
- 12 of injuries received while in Federal or State active duty shall
- 13 be entitled to a [50%] 100% tuition credit at all Pennsylvania

- 1 State-owned colleges or universities or approved trade schools
- 2 in this Commonwealth for a period not exceeding eight semesters
- 3 or four years, whichever is greater.
- 4 (a.1) Spouses.--The spouse of a member of the Pennsylvania
- 5 National Guard who was killed or dies as a result of injuries
- 6 received while in Federal or State active duty shall be entitled
- 7 to a 100% tuition credit at any Pennsylvania State-owned college
- 8 or university or approved trade school in this Commonwealth for
- 9 <u>a period not exceeding eight semesters or four years, whichever</u>
- 10 <u>is greater</u>. A spouse shall be eliqible for a tuition credit
- 11 under this subsection for a period not to exceed ten years from
- 12 the date the member is killed or dies as a result of injuries
- 13 while in Federal or State active duty or until the spouse
- 14 remarries, whichever occurs first.
- 15 (b) Department to administer program. -- The department shall
- 16 adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this
- 17 section and shall administer the tuition credit program
- 18 established under this section.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
