AN ACT

1	Amending the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), entitled, as
2	amended, "An act providing property tax or rent rebate and
3	inflation dividends to certain senior citizens, widows,
4	widowers and permanently disabled persons with limited
5	incomes; establishing uniform standards and qualifications
б	for eligibility to receive rebates and dividends; providing
7	for transportation assistance grants and grants to area
8	agencies on aging for services to older persons; and imposing
9	duties upon the Department of Revenue," further defining
10	"income"; and providing a definition for "Social Security
11	substitute pension."

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The definition of "income" in section 3 of the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the Senior Citizens Rebate and Assistance Act, reenacted and amended December 21, 1979 (P.L.570, No.131) and amended June 25, 1999 1 (P.L.226, No.30), is amended and the section is amended by 2 adding a definition to read:

3 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:

4 (1)"Income" means all income from whatever source derived, 5 including but not limited to salaries, wages, bonuses, commissions, income from self-employment, alimony, support 6 7 money, cash public assistance and relief, the gross amount of any pensions or annuities including railroad retirement benefits 8 for calendar years prior to 1999, and fifty per cent of railroad 9 10 retirement benefits for calendar years 1999 and [thereafter] 11 2000, all benefits received under the Federal Social Security Act (except Medicare benefits) for calendar years prior to 1999, 12 13 and fifty per cent of all benefits received under the Federal 14 Social Security Act (except Medicare benefits) for calendar 15 years 1999 and [thereafter] 2000, all benefits received under 16 State unemployment insurance laws and veterans' disability 17 payments, all interest received from the Federal or any State 18 government, or any instrumentality or political subdivision 19 thereof, realized capital gains, rentals, workmen's compensation 20 and the gross amount of loss of time insurance benefits, life 21 insurance benefits and proceeds (except the first five thousand 22 dollars (\$5,000) of the total of death benefit payments), and gifts of cash or property (other than transfers by gift between 23 members of a household) in excess of a total value of three 24 25 hundred dollars (\$300), but shall not include surplus food or other relief in kind supplied by a governmental agency or 26 27 property tax or rent rebate or inflation dividend. For calendar 28 years 2001 and thereafter, "income" shall not include: fifty per cent of all benefits received under the Federal Social Security 29 30 Act (except Medicare benefits) and fifty per cent of any Social - 2 -20010H1220B1411

1 <u>Security substitute pension.</u>

2 * * *

3 (10) "Social Security substitute pension" means a pension received as a result of a person's employment by a government 4 entity or an instrumentality of a government entity if such 5 pension is, in whole or in part, provided in lieu of old age and 6 survivors benefit payments under the Federal Social Security 7 Act. The term includes Tier I railroad retirement benefits. The 8 9 amount of the pension that qualifies as a "Social Security substitute pension" shall not exceed the maximum Federal old age 10 and survivors benefit payments to which an individual eligible 11 12 for such payments would be entitled, less any Federal old age 13 and survivors benefit payments received under the Federal Social Security Act for employment covered under such act. 14 15 Section 2. This act shall apply to claims filed for calendar year 2001 and each year thereafter. 16

17 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
