AN ACT

Amending the act of February 14, 1986 (P.L.2, No.2), entitled 1 "An act regulating the right to practice acupuncture; 2 requiring the licensure of acupuncturists; and providing a penalty," further providing for definitions, for regulation of the practice of acupuncture, for penalties and for 5 approval of acupuncture educational programs. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of February 14, 1986 (P.L.2, 10 No.2), known as the Acupuncture Licensure Act, is amended by 11 adding definitions to read: Section 2. Definitions. 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 13 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 15 16 * * * "East Asian herbology." The use of herbal preparations and 17 18 products that contain as active ingredients parts of plants,

minerals and other organic materials or a combination of these

- 1 items administered according to East Asian medicine tradition to
- 2 normalize function.
- 3 "Herbal therapy." The application of East Asian herbology to
- 4 the treatment of acupuncture patients.
- 5 <u>"Practitioner of Oriental medicine." An acupuncturist who is</u>
- 6 registered LICENSED by the board to use herbal therapy.

- 7 Section 2. Section 3(h) of the act is amended and the
- 8 section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 9 Section 3. Regulation of the practice of acupuncture.

- 11 (h) [Section not applicable to dentists, podiatrists and
- 12 veterinarians] <u>Exemptions from licensure</u>.--This section shall
- 13 not apply to [a]:
- 14 (1) A dentist performing acupuncture in connection with
- the practice of dentistry, a podiatrist performing
- 16 acupuncture in connection with the practice of podiatry or a
- 17 veterinarian performing acupuncture on animals in connection
- 18 with the practice of veterinary medicine. The State Board of
- 19 Dentistry with regard to dentists, the State Board of
- 20 Podiatry with regard to podiatrists and the State Board of
- 21 Veterinary Medical Examiners with regard to veterinarians
- 22 shall assure that licensees of that board who perform
- acupuncture have what that board determines to be the proper
- 24 education or demonstrated experience in the performance of
- acupuncture.

- 27 <u>certificate, registration or permit to practice acupuncture</u>
- from another state, territory or country and seeks to
- 29 practice acupuncture in this Commonwealth for the limited
- 30 purpose of attending a continuing education acupuncture

- 3 (2) An individual who is a practitioner of Oriental
- 4 <u>medicine shall wear a tag or badge with lettering clearly</u>

- 6 <u>title "practitioner of Oriental medicine."</u>
- 7 Section 3. Sections 5(a) and 6.1 of the act are amended to

- 9 Section 5. Penalties.
- 10 (a) Licensure.--
- 11 <u>(1)</u> Except as provided for in section 3(e), <u>(h)(1)</u> and
- 12 (j), unless an individual is licensed as an acupuncturist by
- the board, it shall be unlawful for an individual to:
- 14 <u>(i) hold oneself out to be an acupuncturist or a</u>
- practitioner of acupuncture; or
- 16 (ii) practice acupuncture in this Commonwealth
- [unless the individual is licensed as an acupuncturist by
- one of the boards].
- 19 (2) An individual willfully violating the provisions of
- this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the third
- 21 degree.

- 23 Section 6.1. [Approval of acupuncture] <u>Acupuncture</u> educational
- programs.
- 25 (a) Approval. -- The Department of Education of the
- 26 Commonwealth shall approve any acupuncture educational program
- 27 that meets the relevant and appropriate requirements of 22 Pa.
- 28 Code (relating to education) and 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to
- 29 private colleges, universities and seminaries) and that meets or
- 30 exceeds the standards required for acupuncture or oriental

- 1 medicine programs established by an accrediting agency
- 2 recognized by the United States Department of Education.
- 3 (b) Continuing education. --
- 4 (1) Acupuncturists must attend and complete 30 hours of
- 5 <u>mandatory continuing education during each two-year license</u>
- 6 period. Nationally certified education courses shall be
- 7 <u>considered as creditable, in addition to any other courses</u>
- 8 <u>the board deems creditable toward meeting the requirements</u>
- 9 for continuing education. Credit may not be given for any
- 10 <u>course in office management or practice building.</u>
- 11 (2) An individual applying for the first time for
- 12 <u>licensure as an acupuncturist in this Commonwealth shall be</u>
- 13 <u>exempted from the continuing education requirements under</u>
- 14 paragraph (1) for the biennial renewal period following
- 15 initial licensure.
- 16 (3) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT, PROMULGATE AND ENFORCE RULES <--
- 17 AND REGULATIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT
- 18 ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS OF CONTINUING EDUCATION TO BE MET
- 19 BY INDIVIDUALS LICENSED AS ACUPUNCTURISTS OR PRACTITIONERS OF
- ORIENTAL MEDICINE UNDER THIS ACT AS A CONDITION FOR RENEWAL
- 21 OF THEIR LICENSES. THE REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE ANY FEES
- 22 NECESSARY FOR THE BOARD TO CARRY OUT ITS RESPONSIBILITIES
- 23 UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 24 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
